Harry Potter Memorabilia And Vintage Horror Posters Galore At Ewbank's

Two-day Entertainment Memorabilia Auction Taking Place On March 1st / 2nd

Ewbank's, Surrey's leading auction house, is preparing for its two-day entertainment memorabilia sale on March <u>1st</u> and <u>2nd</u>, which will feature a huge array of vintage film posters, thousands of rare comics and the chance to snap up Harry Potter film memorabilia.


A call-sheet signed by Daniel Radcliffe, who played Harry Potter, for the final day of principal photography for the Harry Potter film series, is going under the hammer with a guide price of £300 and £500. Dated June 12 2010, it is signed and dedicated to Peter Harvey, who was Radcliffe's personal driver during the Potter filming. It comprises two pages and a letter addressed to Harvey.

A production-made, sealed envelope containing Harry's invitation to attend Hogwart's School, from the 2001 film Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone, has a pre-sale estimate of between £300 and £500. Two styles of envelopes were made for production, with either a rear wax seal or rear printed seal, this has the printed seal.

MR H. POTTER The Cupboard under the Stairs, 4, Privet Drive, Little Whinging, SURREY. Two high-value rare film posters for Ealing Studios' productions are among the many vintage posters on sale at the twoday auction.

A British Quad film poster for the 1963 classic World War II film, **The Cruel Sea**, has an estimate of between £1,400 and £1,800. The artwork is by






Charles Murray, the poster is linen -backed and measures 30 by 40 inches.


An American one-sheet film poster for the 1946 English horror film, **Dead of Night**, carries a pre-sale guide price of between £1,000 and £1,500. The poster is folded and measures 27 by 41 inches.

Other horror film posters going on sale include a US double-bill lobby card promoting 1940s films **Son of Frankenstein** and **Bride of Frankenstein**, starring Basil Rathbone and Boris Karloff, which has been valued at between £300 and £500. Plus, a US half-sheet poster for 1952 horror film, **Cat People**, has a guide price of £100 to £150. Rock fans will jump at the chance to buy an original poster for a 1973 Cardiff Castle concert by the Rolling Stones. The gig was cancelled and many of the posters were recalled, giving this lot an extra appeal to collectors. It has been valued at between £250 and £350, it is rolled and measures 20 by 30 inches.

A 'black' collector's edition of the V&A's David Bowie exhibition, David Bowie Is, will be going on sale with a guide price of £700 to £900. This acclaimed catalogue is number 601 of 1,000, in original packaging and is in as-new condition.

It includes five extra prints, including a photograph taken in Berlin signed by David Bowie, a painting by Bowie, early album artwork, an installation





drawing design and a Kirlian electrophotograph.

One of the most exciting lots going under the hammer on March 1 is an original shooting script from the iconic 1967 film **The Dirty Dozen**, directed Robert Aldrich. It has been consigned for sale by one of the "Dozen," actor Colin Maitland who played Seth Sawyer in the film.

The script is bound in red leather with gold lettering, is dated April 2 1967, and comprises 187 pages, with revision pages and handwritten notes. It comes with a letter of authenticity from Colin Maitland, and carries a pre-sale guide price of between £3,000 and £5,000. A limited edition book, Speed of Life, recounting the incredible career of David Bowie, is going on sale with an estimate of between £800 and £1,200. Compiled by Bowie and photographer and designer Masayoshi Sukita, it is a 300-page photo essay, captioned throughout by Bowie and Sukita, featuring highlight images spanning 40 years, from the early 1970s.



The book on sale at Ewbank's is number 1,124 of 2,000 copies, is signed by both Bowie and Sukita. It includes a specially-created record pressing on 7" vinyl single of Bowie's 1980 recording It's No Game, with slip-cloth cover and original packaging.

COMIC BOOKS

Comic collectors will be delighted by the array of titles on sale in this auction; more than 5,000 will be going under the hammer.

Comics are generally divided into different eras or ages, depending on when they were published. The "Golden Age" is deemed as being 1938 to 1950, which saw the advent of characters such as Superman in 1938, followed by Women Woman and Batman in 1941. Comics provided a cheap source of entertainment during World War II and it wasn't unusual to see sales of a single issue reach more than one million.

The "Silver Age" from 1956 to 1970s saw Atlas Comics change its name to Marvel in 1961, and DC Comics bought back The Flash after a five-year break, leading to a superhero revival. Characters including Spiderman, Thor, The Hulk and X-Men all made their debuts in the 1960s.

During the "Bronze Age" from 1970 to 1985, stories took on a darker and grittier atmosphere to reflect troubled social times, and Hollywood used comics as inspiration for films for the first time, the 1978 film Superman was a huge critical success.



The "Modern Age" of comics from 1985 to the present day, saw a decline in comic sales. However major media group acquisitions, Warner Bros bought DC Comics, and Disney bought Marvel, saw comic superheroes, including Batman and The Avengers, switch to the silver screen.

Highlights among the many comic on sale include a 1962 Marvel comic, Tales of Suspense - No. 39, which features the very first appearance of Iron Man. The plot was written by Stan Lee and the artwork by Don Heck, it has been valued at between £400 and £600.

A collection of more than 95 X-Men Marvel comics are being sold as one lot, with a pre-sale guide of £600 to £900. It comprises comics from the first issue in

A vast array of vintage posters will also be on sale, including a rare poster from the ever-popular James Bond franchise. The Italian format poster,

featuring artwork by Averardo Cirello, for the 1962 film Dr No, starring Sean Connery as Bond, has a pre-sale estimate of between £1,000 and £1,500.

A **Woodstock** 1970 original first print poster, featuring Jimi Hendrix, The Who and Jefferson Airplane, carries an estimate of between £500 and £800. It has been signed by Grace Slick of Jefferson Airplane.

A British Quad film poster for George Lucas' 1977 film Star Wars, featuring artwork by Tom Chantrell, has a guide price of between £500 and £800.



Rare Offerings From Film Classics Headline Heritage Auctions' April Movie Posters Auction

Posters from The Mummy, Casablanca could yield six-figure returns

DALLAS, Texas (Feb. 14, 2018) – A pre-war Belgian poster for <u>The Mummy</u> (Universal, 1933) and the first post-war French release double grande from <u>Casablanca (Warner</u> <u>Brothers, 1947)</u> are expected to vie for top-lot honors in Heritage Auctions' <u>Movie Posters</u> <u>Auction</u> April 7-8 in Dallas. Each carries a pre-auction estimate of \$60,000-120,000.

The 24-1/2-by-33-1/2-inch stone litho from *The Mummy*, which is making its Heritage debut, is the only remaining Belgian from this classic in which Boris Karloff portrayed Imhotep, the mummy of an ancient Egyptian high priest who escapes years after being buried alive. The well-preserved piece comes from Universal's original European distribution.

"Our spring auctions traditionally offer posters with stunning images from some of the most iconic movies ever made," Heritage Auctions Vintage Posters Director Grey Smith said. "We believe there are rare posters in this wonderful group for every taste." A <u>London After Midnight (MGM, 1927</u>) Argentinean one sheet (est. \$30,000-60,000) shines a spotlight on one of the "holy grails" of lost cinema, the last known copy of the film which was destroyed in a fire in an MGM studio vault in 1965. Posters from the film, which starred Lon Chaney and was directed by *Dracula* director Tod Browning, have been as elusive as the film itself over the last 80 years, and this Argentinean one sheet is the first to be offered through Heritage since 2009.

A 21-by-58-inch Japanese STB tatekan from <u>The</u> <u>Seven Samurai (Toho, 1954)</u> (est. \$20,000-50,000) is an extraordinary collectible poster for fans of Japanese cinema and director Akira Kurosawa. This rare country-of-origin poster from Kurosawa's most prestigious film is believed to be the only known copy in existence. A bittersweet tale of the price of



war and the loss of noble warriors, *The Seven Samurai* is one of the most influential films in cinema history and was among the highest-grossing films ever made in Japan.



An oversized Swedish <u>King Kong (RKO,</u> <u>1933</u>) poster (est. \$20,000-50,000) features "The Eighth Wonder of the World" raging through New York, holding Fay Wray in one hand while smacking planes out of the sky with the other. Considered by most to be among the greatest horror/fantasy films ever made, *King Kong* definitely was one of the most innovative, using stop-motion animation that became the industry standard for decades. The rare, oversized stone litho Swedish poster, from the Kirk Hammett Collection, is reminiscent of the U.S. three sheet with its striking image of King Kong atop the Empire State Building.

The 90th edition of the Academy Awards - aka The Oscars - is scheduled to be broadcasted on March 4th. While most of the movies nominated have not had massive Popular recognition, we always hope the electing jury will find worthy additions to the incredible list of previous winners.

For those of you who need a quick recap, I suggest you look at this incredible limited edition poster created in 2013 by <u>Olly Moss</u> who cleverly designed unique statuettes in line with each movie theme for all previous Best Picture winners.

THIS WEEK'S BLOG (click here) selected 10 past winning (or nominated) Best Movies from 1959 to 1974 displayed once again thru the visual angle of the Italian fotobusta format which is showcased this month. The multiple images filled with great design and colors will no doubt remind you of the incredible scenes, costumes and characters that are indelibly engraved in our collective consciousness.


Here's one of them. The complete set of 8 movie posters for what is considered one of the greatest movies of all time, i.e <u>The Godfather Part 1</u>.



NEW ITEMS: We keep exploring the massive **2018 WINTER COLLECTION** which includes 1,150 posters, all available in the <u>NEW PRODUCTS section</u>, with a selection of 15 posters, most of them being past Oscar winners or featuring Oscar winning Actors.

<u>Sleeping Beauty</u> was only nominated for one Oscar (Best Music) in 1959 yet remains the most lavishly illustrated <u>Walt Disney</u> animated movie ever produced as shown in the gorgeous half sheet poster (1970 rerelease).

In a very crowded field at the 1967 Academy Awards, the racially charged thriller, <u>In The Heat Of The Night</u>, won the Best Picture Award (along with 4 other statuettes including best actor to <u>Rod Steiger</u> - as <u>Sidney Poitier</u> was not nominated - he had won in 1963.)




El Cid, the 1961 epic stars Charlton Heston as the legendary Spanish hero battling the moors and uniting Spain in the process. The movie was nominated for 3 Oscars but didn't win any, yet it remains one of the greatest epics of all time (featuring no less than 30,000 soldiers in what is one of the largest movie battles ever filmed) and the Italian poster designed for the 1972 rerelease exudes noblesse and grandeur!

To make up for the fact that they only gave 2 technical Oscars to <u>Apocalypse Now</u>, the best Vietnam War movie ever made, the Academy made it up in 1987 by awarding 4 Oscars (including Best Picture and Best director) to <u>Platoon</u>. Here is the rare Japanese style B featuring a stunning image of then-fresh-faced Charlie Sheen...Kids don't do drugs!

Despite having an all-star cast (including several Oscar nominated actors: Peter





<u>O'Toole, Omar Sharif, Christopher Plummer</u>), the 1967 World War 2 thriller, <u>The Night</u> <u>Of the Generals</u>, failed to win any nomination. Still the Italian poster (maybe an early 1970's rerelease) deserves to be included in any proper movie poster collection with its striking Art. A Sixties icon, <u>Julie Christie</u> kept dazzling us in so many classic movies including <u>Darling</u> for which she won the Best Actress award in 1966. Very rare vintage Japanese poster with a unique illustration.



Despite being nominated as Best Actor <u>Paul Newman</u> lost to Rod Steiger (see above). His co-star <u>George Kennedy</u> won the Best Supporting Actor statue as the inmate in the 1967 Prison drama <u>Cool Hand Luke</u>. Here is the very rare Italian poster painted by <u>Ercole</u> <u>Brini</u>.

<u>Diane Keaton</u>'s luminous smile enlightens <u>Annie Hall</u>, the 4 Oscars' winning movie directed and starring <u>Woody Allen</u>, for which she won the Best Actress award. The Japanese poster (without Oscar logo) is one of the two we have.

<u>Lee Marvin</u> deserves his Best actor Oscar for his dual role in <u>Cat Ballou</u>, the 5 times nominated 1966 Western co-starring <u>Jane Fonda</u> at her most sensual and toughest as shown in the very rare complete vintage set of 8 Italian fotobusta posters



Nominated for seven Oscars, the <u>Gene Kelly</u> directed 1969 musical <u>Hello Dolly</u> swept all the sound and musical categories but failed to garner any nominations for <u>Barbra</u> <u>Streisand</u> nor <u>Walter Matthau</u>. The beautiful Japanese poster explodes with joy and colors.

A superb brand new limited edition print for <u>The Three Caballeros</u>, the 1944 Disney animated film nominated for two Oscars. Incredible Art by Hackto Oshiro.


An Actor's Actor, <u>Marlon Brando</u> was nominated no less than 8 times for the Best Actor Award which he won twice. <u>The Ugly American</u>, the 1963 Cold War South East Asian adventure movie may not be one of his best know yet the ultra rare Japanese poster is among the best Brando posters ever designed.




<u>Elvis Presley</u>'s acting career is often derided and was never close to granting him any Oscar nomination. Despite this fact, I wanted to include the King's very very very rare vintage Danish poster for <u>Jailhouse Rock</u>.

Featured in the Blog, <u>West Side Story</u> won 10 Oscars (out of 11 nominations) and its timeless message, music and lyrics haven't aged a bit. Admire the Japanese poster designed for the 1969 rerelease.

And we conclude with a man who didn't win an Oscar but so many more medals as one of the most incredible athletes and icons of the 20th Century, i.e. <u>Muhammad Ali</u> here in the vintage 1978 personality poster featuring one of his trademark claims, "Float Like A Butterfly, Sting Like A Bee".


