STANLEY KUBRICK MEMORABILIA AUCTION: 24,000 EUROS FOR THE JACKET FROM THE SHINING

Jack Torrance's jacket in The Shining was sold by Aste Bolaffi for 24,000 euros (including buyer's premium). After a long battle of Internet bids, a Californian collector won the jacket included in the cinema auction dedicated to Stanley Kubrick. The burgundy velvet jacket, one of the most iconic stage clothes in film history, was the top lot of the sale.

Many enthusiasts and curious participants attended the auction of **Emilio D'Alessandro**'s collection, the director's long-time assistant, and over one hundred bidders participated from all over the world, especially from the United States.





The **most iconic set props** were highly sought-after, in particular: the **rug with an optical design** from the **Colorado Lounge** in the Overlook Hotel, where the crazy main character "works" on his novel, sold to an American buyer for **16,250 euros**, and the **long film fragment** of "The Shining" given to D'Alessandro by the director, which sold for **8,100 euros**. Kubrick's **military jacket** sold for **12,500 euros** and his **membership card** for the "Writers Guild of America", the American union for screenwriters, was a great success, rising from a starting price of 1,000 euros to a final price of **16,250 euros**.

The collection of signed letters from the director achieved very good results as well, in particular **"The last mail pickup**", the last message written by Kubrick to Emilio, in which the director admits that he is very sad that Emilio will soon return to Italy, was sold for **2,000 euros**.

An Italian Two Fogli for the 1964 film **Spartacus**, from Kubrick's early years, sold for 250 euros; an Italian Two Fogli for **Lolita** sold for 175 euros; an Italian Locandina for **Dr. Strangelove** sold for 375 euros; and an **2001: A Space Odyssey** Italian Locandina sold for 300 euros.

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French Casablanca Double Grande Boosts Heritage Auctions' Movie Posters Auction To Nearly \$2 Million

Top lot one of just two known to exist

DALLAS, Texas (April 9, 2018) – A rare post-war French release double grande poster from *Casablanca* soared to \$143,400, helping Heritage Auctions' <u>Movie Posters Auction</u> reach \$1,958,775 in total sales.

A film that was made with the hope of creating a successful war drama only to evolve into a beloved classic is represented beautifully in this <u>Casablanca (Warner Brothers, 1947)</u> <u>First Post-War French Release</u> <u>Double Grande</u>, which drew multiple bids before ultimately selling for \$143,400. This poster is extraordinarily rare, one of just two known to exist anywhere, and features artwork believed to have

been done by Hervé Morvan, the popular 20th-century poster artist.

"This auction contained a variety of desirable posters for collectors of all tastes," Heritage Auctions Vintage Posters Director Grey Smith said. "The



Casablanca poster is a beautiful poster that drew the attention of our most serious collectors."

One of the most actively pursued lots in the auction was a <u>Superman (Columbia,</u> <u>1948) Six Sheet</u>, which realized \$35,850. The first comic book superhero made it to the big screen in a live-action format 10 years after he first was introduced in <u>Action Comics #1</u>. This poster also is exceptionally rare – one of just two of this large format known to exist. The poster from <u>The Lady Eve (Paramount, 1941) One Sheet</u> is exceedingly rare, which helped spark demand from multiple bidders before it eventually brought \$33,460. This classic Preston Sturges comedy is considered one of his best.

Believed to be the only known copy in existence, <u>Morocco (Paramount,</u> <u>931) French Horizontal Double Grande</u> validated its rarity when it passed its high pre-auction estimate on its way to a final sale price of \$31,070. This extraordinary French stone lithograph from Josef von Sternberg's classic drama bears a magnificent image for a magnificent film. Roger Soubie's depiction of the sultry Marlene Dietrich is considered one of the best illustrations ever painted of the star.

Offered for the first time through Heritage Auctions, <u>Adventures of Captain</u> <u>Marvel (Republic, 1941). One Sheet Chapter 1—"Curse of the Scorpion"</u> is another that sparked significant competition among bidders before ultimately yielding \$31,070. This poster is one of only a small handful still known to exist from what many consider to be one of the greatest serials produced.

2018 A Big Year for The Last Moving Picture Company and Hollywood Poster Auction

Beginning in May, a 12-page color brochure of auction highlights will be distributed to our mailing list of 3,500 collectors. A limited quantity will remain available for those not already on our mailing list on a first come, first serve basis.

To date, the Hollywood Poster Auction has sold over 8 million dollars' worth of movie memorabilia. Aside from all of our wonderful consignors over the years, the Hollywood Poster Auction benefits from having access to the amazing store stock amassed by The Last Moving Picture Company, founded by Morris Everett, Jr. owner of the world's largest collection of movie posters.



A portion of Mr. Everett's collection of over 200,000 posters was auctioned two years ago by Profiles in History in a pair of highly publicized auctions with sales totaling an amazing 4 million dollars. The unsold ninety-five percent of that collection now resides at The Last Moving Picture Company and serious collectors from all over the country and even internationally have traveled to Cleveland to shop the collection.

The collection is now also being sold via Morris Everett's eBay store, under seller name Lastmo. Beginning in 2017, The Last Moving Picture Company officially threw its hat into the eBay ring, selling an impressive \$50,000 worth of lobby cards in just 12 months. New items are added almost daily, so collectors who can't make the trip to Cleveland to view the collection in person still have access to many fantastic items.

There are still well over 180,000 lobby cards and posters from Mr. Everett's personal collection which have now been added to the Last Moving Picture Company's already impressive store stock of 50,000 posters and 400,000 stills, making the store a must stop destination for serious collectors. Those who visit usually spend days there, taking advantage of nearby lodgings to afford them the time needed to browse through so much material. This brings us to the latest piece of news sure to excite still collectors.

In addition to The Last Moving Picture Company, Morris Everett, Jr. is also the co-owner of the Everett Collection, an entertainment photo leasing archive located in New York City. For the last several years, a massive effort was made to digitize the collection of physical images housed at the New York location. Once this monumental task was completed, the physical images were moved to The Last Moving Picture Company's Cleveland store and are being offered for sale.

This titanic sized archive contains over 2 million alphabetized stills from film and television housed in 250 filing cabinets. Those who have already been lucky enough to see this collection have been overwhelmed by its enormity as well as the staggering quality and variety of stills it contains. Nearly everything from the iconic to the obscure is represented. It is truly a still collector's dream.

Serious collectors are urged to come to Cleveland to see it for themselves and shop. They will not be disappointed. The stills will also be arranged into lots and be offered for sale beginning in August via a series of live internet auctions. More details and the exact date of the first of these auctions will be available as it draws closer!

Liquid Sky (1982) - (Anne Carlisle) US one-sheet

This is a 27" x 40" US poster for the 1982 Slava Tsukerman film *Liquid Sky* based on a screenplay by Slava Tsukerman, Anne Carlisle and Nina V. Kerova and starring Anne Carlisle as Margaret/Jimmy. Plot summary: In New York City a lonely woman watches as a flying saucer lands on a rooftop across the street where a lesbian drug dealer and her lover are living. This is a movie arcade randomly populated with cardboard acting, industrial lighting on primary colors, a synthesized soundtrack, narcissistic androgyny, rough kinky sex, drugs and invisible space aliens mixing with humans. No sky here, despite the title; no daylight either, mostly neon and strobe. The poster is great.

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It's All About the Posters

Need slammed into opportunity one day in early 2016. It started with a conversation between Ed and Susan Poole, founders of Learn About Movie Posters, and Linda Thurman, the author of *Hollywood South: Glamour, Gumbo and Greed*. The three met when Thurman was researching her book and discovered the rich Poole Collection of poster images, some of which became illustrations in her book.

Ed and Sue explained the need for preservation and research of movie posters and paper. Since 1995 the Pooles have written and published more than 20 research books on film accessories. With the millions spent in the U.S. on *film* preservation, they had not been able to find a single organization dedicated to film accessories preservation—no poster preservation societies, no groups to preserve film accessories.

They found many museums and preservation institutions were reluctant to devote resources to film accessories because of their fragility, difficulty with identification, thorny provenance, and long-accepted status as an unimportant necessity of the movie business. The rare exception might be collections celebrating a prominent individual or classic film.

The concept of a research center intrigued Thurman, an experienced founder and board member of nonprofit organizations. The recently-retired studio executive was looking around for an interesting project.

After a crash course in film accessories, Thurman accepted the challenge, and the Institute for Cinema Ephemera was born. A year later, the name was changed to Movie Poster Archives.

Immediately, the challenges of preserving movie posters became obvious and compelling. To quote Arthur Miller's Death of a Salesman: "Attention must be paid."

The first challenge was the magnitude of film accessories. For a medium size film, hundreds of different film accessories are created: pressbooks, insert cards, promos, portraits, heralds, lobby cards in sets, mini lobby cards, jumbo lobby cards, half sheets, window cards, mini window cards, jumbo window cards, 30x40s, 40x60s, one sheets, 2 sheets, 3 sheets, 6 sheets, 12 sheets, 24 sheets, door panels, banners, standees, and sometimes varying sets and several styles. Plus rarities such as trolley cards, secondary printers, and local or regional production.

Complicating the matter, from the 1920s until the 1970s, an average film usually stayed on the market for up to two years, going from studio theaters to 'A' theaters to regular theaters to neighborhood theaters then by bus or train to smaller towns and rural communities. Then studios disposed of the paper accessories that survived.

Throughout the industry, original movie paper was not for sale to the public. The result is that certain silent film posters bring incredibly high valuations since there may be only 1 or 2 in existence.

In the 1920s, *poster exchanges* arose to handle the wide variety of accessories needed to continually supply rural theaters. Local businessmen started buying up movie paper when the film was first released and later supplying the rural theaters.

The monolithic National Screen Service appeared in 1940. It supplied the movie trailers to all theaters nationally and expanded into handling movie paper. By 1947 all of the major studios contracted exclusively with NSS for accessory distribution. Lawsuits from poster exchanges ensued. Eventually dozens of poster exchanges shut down, each with hundreds of thousands of posters in stock. Despondent and defeated, they hauled their inventory to the dump.

In a move that changed the course of movie paper history, some smart businessmen bought truckloads of these posters, creating the first collecting dealers.

National Screen Service continued to dominate accessory distribution until 1984, when the advent of multiplex theaters made it too costly to continue. Distribution went back to the individual studios. Once more, the gradual elimination of all the NSS warehouses, each holding hundreds of

thousands of posters, created an opportunity for dealers and collectors to acquire truckloads of movie paper. The surge in availability expanded the poster collecting hobby exponentially.

These historic documents were in the hands of movie poster collectors and dealers. The two major liquidations--of poster exchanges and NSS exchanges—made a wide variety of movie paper available to the public.

The knowledge base about posters and movie paper was lacking, to say the least. Institutions such as museums and preservationists continued to focus on film. The few institutions that received donations had no resources to learn how to read the markings, date or verify any of the information, and therefore no system for cataloging them.

Film accessories were normally produced on cheap acidic paper that is costly to maintain. They are also a pain to store, a pain to handle and a pain to present. Because they are such a problem, and cost so much to properly preserve, institutions have quietly allow them to decay and disintegrate so they can be removed from their inventory.


A new day dawned in 1995 when Ed and Susan Poole began organizing the chaos. They released the first reference book on the industry in 1997. Since that time, they have released an additional 21 industry-related reference books, in addition to posting over 200,000 pages online.

Their work continues as consulting archivists and researchers for the Movie Poster Archives. With 400,000 items in the Archives, more staff and resources will be needed.

As digital displays threaten the very existence of new movie posters, the preservation of the historic posters is all the more important.



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
















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
