

We point out a rich corpus of posters illustrated by Anselmo Ballester, the great Italian designer, realized between the 30s and 40s, very rare subjects and barely seen on international auctions.

Ballester titles include:

Vogues of 1938, 1938;
Gangway, 1939;
The Healer, 1941.



Another rarity is the Italian playbill (Locandina) for <u>Sullivan's Travels</u> with Veronica Lake (lot 102) never seen in Italian auctions; the playbill (Locandina) for <u>Casablanca</u> (lot 161) a later edition very requested by collectors all over the world; and an R1956 playbill (Locandina) for the classic <u>Gone with the Wind</u> (lot 145).

ANSELMO BALLESTER AND THE FILM POSTERS, BETWEEN CULTURED SUGGESTIONS AND CONTEMPORARY INNOVATION

Anselmo Ballester, son of a painter, precocious talent, a multifaceted and extremely talented artist, was THE poster designer for Italian film posters. His are some of the most sought-after titles on the international market: especially his version of Stagecoach with John Wayne, but also iconic posters depicting the sensual and divine Rita Hayworth, not to mention the enormous quantity of projects, sketches and drawings made for films now largely considered to be minor examples of the cinematographic art.

There are about 3000 known subjects realized by him. Today, some of his posters still make the hearts of passionate collectors from all over the world beat fast, contending for them to the sound of ever rising bids, while some true masterpieces in the art of international posters are exhibited in the most important museums dedicated to cinema and its history.

Ballester's career traverses the golden age of the tenth art: from its beginnings, with his first sketch made in 1914, to the late 1950's. From mute to sound, from black and white to color, his creations have accompanied the evolution of the film industry and its communication sector, which thanks to his contribution has reached extraordinary levels of grandeur for both Italian and foreign productions.

After a debut in IGAP and an initial approach to the world of publicity signs, he soon became known for his extraordinary portraiture. In the 1920's, in order to face an ever growing number of orders, he founded the BCM Agency with his friends Capitani and Martinati, monopolizing the orders from production companies on an international scale.

His style is unmistakable: the surreal and magnetic colors are accompanied by a play of perspective planes that allows us to conceive the poster as a modern evolution of the seventeenth-century frontispiece while the images of the protagonists in the foreground are completely surrounded by other scenes from the film. His posters become meta-narrative, in an extraordinary visual compendium and dreamlike charm which offers a taste of the entire plot.

The extraordinary expressive capacity which shines through in the faces and bodies, often reproduced almost in a photographic manner, is given by the exceptional study that Ballester performed for each client: starting with the documentation and research of information regarding the historical context, fashion, hairstyles and furnishings, dozens of small sketches were then executed which then flowed into the definitive sketch from which the final print was made.

This meticulous research is one of the characteristics that makes Ballester's posters so fascinating, imbued with a cultured and intellectual taste and historical research, giving them the added value which has made them so famous all over the world.

Over the years <u>Aste Bolaffi</u> has had the privilege of auctioning dozens of copies of posters by the Roman master; it is therefore not surprising to come across his name browsing through our catalogs.

# AN EVENING TO REMEMBER ... HISTORIC VITASCOPE HALL MARKER DEDICATION AND RECEPTION



October 14, 2019 marked a very special moment for the Poole family. Our 23-year mission to get a marker installed at the location of the first seated indoor theater in the country came to fruition – well almost.

On July 26, 1896, William Pop Rock and Walter Wainwright opened up a storefront on New Orleans famous Canal Street and exhibited moving pictures. This was the first recognized location dedicated solely to the exhibition of films. Up to that point, movies were shown as a part of other forms of entertainment, as it was believed by most that this was a "passing fad" and that movies alone could not draw an audience. Rock and Wainwright proved them wrong and ushered in the era of the motion picture theater.

For 23 years, we have tried, without success, to get a marker placed at this site to commemorate this historic event. Finally, with the help of some dedicated and determined individuals, a marker was unveiled, albeit in a temporary installation.

#### DEDICATION AND RECEPTION

Before the marker was officially dedicated, a reception was hosted by philanthropists and sponsors Russ and Sandra Herman. Catered by the Palace Café, the event was held at the new Sazarec House which is located one block from the Vitascope Hall location.

The over 100 attendees represented individuals from state and local government, the New Orleans Film Society, local entertainment and supporters. Entertainment was provided by the Kinfolk Brass Band.





Sandra Herman emceed a program featuring remarks from those directly involved in the project. A short program of films which were actually shown at the Vitascope Hall in 1896 followed. After the reception, a traditional New Orleans "Second Line," led by the Kinfolk Brass Band proceeded from the Sazerac House down Canal Street to the location of the former Vitascope Hall. The black ribbon was cut by Ed (below left) and Russ Herman (below right) and the marker was unveiled.



#### THE MARKER

The double-sided marker presents a brief history of The Vitascope Hall as well as the only known image of the founders, William "Pop" Rock, Walter Wainwright and projectionist William Reed ,at the Vitascope Hall location. The marker also reflects its sponsors: "The Poole Collection (that's us) and the families of Russ and Sandra Herman."



#### **PERMANENT INSTALLATION**

Our 23-year-odyssey would not go off without a hitch, however. Due to a number of circumstances, including the tragic collapse of the Hard Rock Hotel project located just blocks from the Vitascope Hall site, the marker could not be permanently installed. City officials and workers who were scheduled to take part in the ceremony were not available as they were on the site of the collapse. Fortunately, the temporary installation allowed for the unveiling and subsequent picture taking. A permanent installation will take place once city resources are available.

#### A LONG AND WINDING ROAD ...

In 1996, we wrote a letter to the City of New Orleans requesting that a marker be placed at the site to observe its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We had learned about Vitascope Hall years earlier from our friend, and movie poster enthusiast, Don Lee Keith. He was guest curator for an exhibit held in New Orleans highlighting Louisiana's rich film history. We met with positive responses to our request, but nothing was actually done to achieve this goal.

For years following this request, we spoke to whomever we thought could help in this quest. Finally, in 2014, Ed and I met Michael W. Domingue, the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism's Recreational Trails Program Administrator who started the marker process. As is typical when working with government, the application got stuck in the bureaucratic mire waiting for approval.

We all but gave up hope of having the marker when we met author Linda Thurman. At the time, Linda was conducting research for her book *Hollywood South: Glamour, Gumbo, and Greed*. (A great read by the way). As a former movie industry executive, she understood the historical significance of this site. She also shared our passion for preserving movie posters and film accessories which led to her establishing the Movie Poster Archives (but that's another story).

Linda turned to New Orleans philanthropists Russ and Sandra Herman who signed on as sponsors to underwrite the project. With backing, Linda and Michael got the ball rolling again with the aid of Lt. Gov. Billy Nungesser. Lynne Coxwell, who oversees the Louisiana Historical Marker Program, helped with the application process.

Approved and purchased in 2016, the marker has been in storage in a City of New Orleans warehouse. Mayor LaToya Cantrell's executive office director Amy Rodenberger brought the project to the attention of the mayor, who quickly appointed director of constituent services Bryon Cornelison to oversee the crucial last stages of installation.

All of this effort culminated in the unveiling of this beautiful marker, establishing New Orleans' significant contribution to the multi-billion dollar film industry.

#### PROCLAMATIONS

As if the marker unveiling wasn't enough, Ed and I were invited to the New Orleans City Council Chambers where we were presented with a proclamation from Councilwoman Kristin Gisleson Palmer and Councilman Jared C. Brossett. Later that day, we were treated to a lunch hosted by Russ and Sandra Herman where we were each presented with a Louisiana Volunteer Service Award signed by Lieutenant Governor Billy Nungesser.



Needless to say, Ed and I, on behalf of The Poole Collection, are now happy campers. The event brought attention to the efforts of Pop Rock, Walter Wainwright and William Reed and what they accomplished. Hopefully, they are smiling down on us.





Let's turn to elegance with a stunning portrait of <u>Catherine</u> <u>Deneuve</u> used for the very rare large teaser Japanese poster for <u>Un Flic</u>, the French 1972 thriller directed by <u>Jean-Pierre</u> <u>Melville</u>.

Sixties Design by the genial <u>Gunther Kieser</u> with the <u>1967</u> <u>Berlin Jazz Festival</u> poster (one of the rarest of the series) featuring Miles Davis among other Jazz luminaries

More ocular design with another sublime image created for the large German poster of **Fantastic Voyage**, the 1966 cult Sci-Fi adventure movie starring **Raquel Welch**.

<u>Ray Charles</u> may not have seen but the 'Genius' sure could hear the right notes, hence his endorsement for the <u>Craig Car Stereo Powerplay</u> line as shown in the very rare vintage 1976 advertising poster.

We skipped Dracula in the Blog so here he is on the very rare and very large 2 panel Italian poster for <u>The Satanic Rites Of Dracula</u>, the 1970 episode of the Vampire saga starring <u>Christopher Lee</u>. Art by <u>Ezio Tarantelli</u>.







The Concert For Bangladesh still remains to this day one of the greatest live concert filmed and recorded thanks to the magnificent performances of George Harrison, Bob Dylan, Eric Clapton, Leon Russell, Ravi Shankar, Ringo Starr, Billy Preston and some many more crack musicians. Here is the beautiful Japanese poster.

If we talk about Supergroups, then Marvel Comics' The Invaders was - in the early 1940's - the first supergroup ever created. They are all here on this brand new Mondo limited edition print titled <u>The Golden Age Of Marvel</u> <u>Comics</u> by Rich Kelly.

Comic Art style with one of the true giants and genius of the genre, <u>Jack Davis</u>. His trademark 'Cavalcade" style has been used on so many illustrations and posters but the one for <u>It's A Mad Mad Mad Mad World</u> in 1963 remains the best. Ultra rare half sheet poster.







Bikini posters are always in high demand so let's enjoy the French one designed and painted by <u>Yves Thos</u> and <u>Rene Ferracci</u> for the 1965 teen comedy <u>I'll Take Sweden</u>

Among the many new <u>US Sexploitation one sheet posters</u> added, I really enjoy this one for the 1971 sex documentary, <u>All About Sex Of All Nations</u>.

Another <u>Beatles</u>' rarity is the uniquely designed French poster for the original release of <u>A Hard Day's Night</u>. The poster is already linen backed.

Who said cartoons cannot be sexy? Proof with this fantastic new limited edition print (with fluorescent inks) by Craig Drake featuring Jessica from <u>Who Framed Roger Rabbit?</u>.



More superb feminine curves with <u>Pleasures Of Hell</u>, one of the most beautiful <u>Japanese Pinky movie poster</u> ever designed.

After nakedness, let's bring Modesty back!!! Iconic design by <u>Bob Peak</u> for the German release of the 1966 Spy Mod classic <u>Modesty Blaise</u> starring <u>Monica Vitti</u>.

<u>Elizabeth Taylor</u> also revealed her ample curves in <u>Butterfield 8</u> which gained her an Oscar. Here she is wearing a nightie on the very rare Belgian movie poster.









Let's add some virility with a colorful painting of <u>Lino</u> <u>Ventura</u> by <u>Lutz Peltzer</u> for the German release of the 1973 French thriller, <u>Le silencieux</u>.

We covered the niche genre of <u>Erotic Western</u> in a previous Blog but I had to add this incredibly rare and graphic Italian poster by <u>Luciano 'Luca'</u> <u>Crovato</u> for the 1977 movie, <u>Sweet Savage</u>, with its lesbian imagery!!!!



## Katharine Hepburn: Dressed for Stage & Screen

#### Exhibit: October 19, 2019 - January 12, 2020

Recognized as one of the greatest actresses of all time, Katharine Hepburn received 12 Best Actress nominations from the Motion Picture Academy—taking the award home four times. In addition to her stellar career on stage and screen, Hepburn became known for her distinct style, wearing trousers at a time when it still raised eyebrows. Her personal preference for relaxed, casual, but chic clothing led to a 1985 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Council of Fashion Designers of America.

This exhibition, drawn from the collection

of the Kent State University Museum, includes a range of costumes and fashions that were instrumental in shaping some of the most memorable characters Hepburn portrayed over her long career.

Featured in the exhibition are costumes from: the stage productions of *The Philadelphia Story* (1939), *Without Love* (1942) and *Coco* (1969); classic films, including *Adam's Rib* (1949), *Stage Door* (1937) and *Long Day's Journey into Night* (1962); and television movies such as *Love Among the Ruins* (1975). More than a dozen different designers are represented, including Hepburn favorites, Walter Plunkett (1902–1982) and Valentina (1899–1989), who were particularly skilled at producing elegant designs for her long-limbed, athletic figure. Some of the other designers represented include Howard Greer (1896–1974), Edith Head (1897–1981), Norman Hartnell (1901–1979), Irene (1901–1962), Ray Diffin (1922–2012), and Jane Greenwood (b. 1934). Additionally, Hepburn's "signature look," an ensemble of tailored beige trousers and linen jackets, will be featured, along with vintage posters, playbills, photos, and related artifacts illustrating Hepburn's remarkable career.

Spotlighting over five decades of the star's career, *Katharine Hepburn: Dressed for Stage & Screen* provides a rich and entertaining look not only at the clothes that helped create indelible characters, but also at the importance of fashion in crafting the image of one of the most memorable performers of the 20th century.
