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EMOVIEPOSTER.COM BI-WEEKLY AUCTIONS COMING SOON!

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Beginning 1/7/2020 all of eMoviePoster.com's auctions are two weeks each! This means we have exactly half the auctions each year that we have had the preceding 20 years. Watch future announcements for full details!



PLUS, we will have SIX major auctions in 2020! Far fewer auctions, and fewer low priced items, but otherwise everything remains exactly the same!

WHY AM I MAKING THIS CHANGE? Several reasons!

1) I have run weekly auctions for just shy of 20 full years (and we had online auctions for a year before we went to regular weekly auctions, and before that we had Major Auctions and semi-annual Sales catalogs for another full ten years), and after 30 years of this (and over 1,600,000 auctions!) I am tired of the non-stop weekly grind (where as soon as one auction is ready, it is time to prepare the next one)!

2) Of those more than 1,600,000 auctions, over half of them were for items that ended up selling for under \$20, and around one quarter were for items that ended up selling for under \$10 each. We usually lose money on most of these items (we spend more in labor preparing the auction and packing and shipping the item than we take in on commission from that item). I am tired of working so hard at auctioning items that we lose money on!

3) I suspect many of the bidders are getting worn out from having to check 999 auctions three times every **WEEK** (every couple of days), and I suspect they would not mind if they could have more of a break between auctions.

SO THAT IS HOW I ARRIVED AT THE NEW BI-WEEKLY AUCTIONS! Here are the pluses:

- 1) They allow me to take off every other week, all year round if I want, because we have half as many auctions (since all run for two weeks, instead of one), and every other week is an "off week" for us (but the auctions continue to run during that time).
- 2) They allow me to catch up on many projects that I have never had time to do, both at work and at home. That is a big plus for me!
- 3) They give bidders some "breathing room" between auctions. Every other week we won't have **ANY** auctions closing. Imagine how happy your spouses will be to learn that they can once again do something with you on (every other) Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday!

Is there a downside to this? I don't think there will be any, other than that everyone will need a little time to get used to the new schedule, but I really feel that once everyone adjusts, they will all say, "I wished you had done this years ago"!

But here is the biggest change. With half as many auctions, we will no longer have the time to auction low value items individually. So starting in January, any items we are consigned that realistically sell for under \$20 each will be placed in bulk lots. And each bulk lot has to realistically sell for \$20 each. So if someone consigns ten \$2 items to us, we will make a single bulk lot out of them, even if they are all different kinds of items. And if they send twenty \$5 items, we would at most make them into five bulk lots, but more likely just one or two. But of course we will also offer to return the items to that person. **BUT ALL ITEMS THAT ARE SENT TO US THAT REALISTICALLY SELL FOR \$20 OR MORE WILL CONTINUE TO BE AUCTIONED INDIVIDUALLY!**

And because we are trying to stop auctioning items with little value, even in bulk lots, know that if consignors send items that are virtually worthless (like old People magazines!), we will either return them to the consignors at their expense, or more reasonably, throw them out. **THEREFORE, CONSIGNMENTS NEED TO EITHER SOLELY CONTAIN ITEMS WITH REALISTIC RETAILS OF \$20 OR MORE EACH, OR A TOTAL REALISTIC RETAIL VALUE OF \$200, so do not send consignments with a value of under \$200 unless all the items are over \$20 each**

And by eliminating most of the low priced individual auctions, we can actually auction more \$20+ items a year than we did when we had twice as many auctions! And we **WON'T** be stopping auctioning low priced items! It is just that we will be auctioning them **ONLY** in bulk lots, and **NOT** in single item auctions. And since I am hoping to do 999 bulk lots every month (instead of our current 500-600), we can also actually auction more sub-\$20 items a year than we did when we had twice as many auctions, except they will be in bulk lots.



Todd Fisher presented a special event and opened an exhibit of rare memorabilia to celebrate Carrie Fisher's legacy in the Star Wars Movies. The exhibit is on view until **December 26th** at TLC Chinese Theatre in Hollywood.

As part of the TCL Chinese Theatre's historic exhibition of STAR WARS: The Rise of Skywalker,

which opened Thursday, December 19, the theatre, home to the Star Wars franchise since 1977, dedicates this engagement to Carrie Fisher. To celebrate Carrie's legacy, and by special arrangement, a variety of never-before-exhibited personal items from Carrie's collection have been loaned to the theatre by Carrie's brother, Todd, for this memorable occasion.

The [Todd Fisher Collection Pop-Up exhibit](#) is on display until Thursday December 26th at the TCL Chinese Theatre in Hollywood.

Among the various items on display are Carrie's light saber, weapons, personal Star Wars scripts, her personalized directors chairs from Star Wars productions in both the United States and England, one of a kind portraits and photos, and ephemera that commemorates her long association with Star Wars. Fans will have a one-of-a-kind experience seeing this rare exhibit which will be on display for one week only. 

# Bonhams/ TCM Presents ... 1939: Hollywood's Greatest Year Auction Results






# That's Entertainment – Ewbank's Run Up £1.25m Sales Total for Film Posters and Memorabilia in 2019

## Auction house celebrate 'phenomenon' as collectors line up to consign their movie and sporting treasures there

**Ewbank's** in Surrey have revealed that they took just over £1.25 million for posters and entertainment memorabilia alone in 2019.

"It's been a phenomenon," says auctioneer Chris Ewbank, who confirmed that his firm's growing reputation in this sector has led to these sales overtaking jewellery as their most successful auctions.

"To a degree there has been a bit of a snowball effect," he says. "From our new *Bond and Beyond* auction in early February and a variety of movie props sales, things really heated up with the Anthony Duggan collection of movie posters in August and culminated in the Andy Johnson collection in December."

Duggan is credited with being London's ultimate film fan. When he died two years ago at the age of 63, the Everyman cinema chain placed a replica Oscar in every one of its foyers with his name on it to celebrate his life. He had built a collection of movie posters over several decades by visiting cinemas each week to pick up the discarded posters from the week before. His persistence and dedication led to a huge collection valued at well into six figures.

Andy Johnson built up his collection over 35 years, catching the collecting bug as he worked on film sale catalogues as a photographer at Christie's in the 1980s. With a 97% sell-through rate at his December 6 sale, Ewbank's recorded a total of close to £145,000, with over £100,000 worth selling online.

In all, the department took £1.25 million from posters, memorabilia and props in 2019. Highlights included:

- Queen Maracas, October: £3.6k hammer
- Jimi Hendrix Poster, May: £2.8k hammer
- Gordon Banks Jersey, February: £4.2k hammer
- Star Wars pencil drawing, May: £2k hammer
- Warriors Jacket, February: £14k hammer
- Lost In Space Sweaters: October: £10.5k hammer (more of these in January)
- Elm Street Glove, October: £8.5k
- Harry Potter Glasses, May: £8k hammer



“As well as Bond, Star Wars has become a massive collecting field in itself,” says specialist Alastair McCrea. “Rare posters dating back to the 1970s can now easily make thousands. But there is also great strength in areas like horror, especially Hammer Horror and Hitchcock, because they have crossover appeal to film buffs, interior decorators and anyone who loves retro.”

“Even so, pound for pound, these posters remain incredible value when you consider the impact they can have on your wall, and of course they lend themselves extremely well to online bidding, so they tick just about all the boxes.”

The enduring appeal of film props, as well as sporting memorabilia directly linked to the top sporting celebrities, also continues to push bidding up. The jacket worn by the lead character in the 1979 cult film *Warriors* took £14,000 in February, while a replica of Scaramanga’s golden gun from the James Bond film sold for £6500 in the same sale.

“One of the most memorable sporting collectables we had this year was Gordon Banks’ jersey, which made £4,200,” says McCrea.



Ewbank's say that it's a classic case of success building on success. "A number of those consigning some of the more important lots come back with the whole collection when they make a good return on the first sale. Others have more than one collection to consign and feed them across as the results roll in. If they're happy with the first sale, then we get the follow-up, and so on," says McCrea.

"Word soon gets round through the ensuing publicity, and that attracts new consignments. We secured one of our best collections after the owner saw media coverage of a previous sale and approached us."

Ewbank's have already announced their first entertainment collection for 2020, the [W.E. Berry Movie Poster Artwork Collection](#), which will be offered in a dedicated sale on February 28.

"This is a particularly interesting collection because it includes hand-painted artwork related to the Bradford firm of W.E. Berry, one of only three printers in Britain that specialised in printing large posters for cinemas," says McCrea.

"They were in business from 1920 to 1990 and printed a lot of posters for films made by Rank and at Ealing Studios."

In fact, The National Science and Media Museum has an archive of W.E. Berry posters and Ewbank's are expecting further institutional interest at the sale.

Highlights include original hand-painted artwork for the 1954 film Creature from the Black Lagoon (estimate £2000-4000), another for the 1955 Ealing comedy The Ladykillers, starring Alec Guinness (£1000-1500) and another for the 1953 Ealing comedy The Titfield Thunderbolt ((£800-1200).

"Talk about rarities," says McCrea. "It's one thing getting your hands on the posters, but to be able to offer the original hand-painted artwork is incredibly rare."

# NAISSANCE DE JESUS (1914) French 55x85

Biographical films about Jesus Christ were not uncommon at the inception of cinema. Several were made in different countries, some as short films and some longer.



In 1913 Pathe Brothers began to film one of the most elaborate of these films. The film was entitled LA VIE DE NOTRE SEIGNEUR JESUS CHRIST (1914). It was filmed in four separate segments, which were exhibited individually and possibly together as one film.

The four segments were entitled NAISSANCE DE JESUS ("The Birth of Jesus"), ENFANCE DE JESUS ("Jesus' Childhood), VIE PUBLIQUE ET MIRACLES ("Public Life and Miracles"), and PASSION ET MORT DE JESUS (The Passion and Death of Jesus").

This poster, which dates from the first release of the film in France, measures 55x85 inches. The poster was published in Paris and the printer is Atelier Faria, 6 Rue Steinkerque, Paris. A notation at the lower left reads "IMP des ETABts PATHE FRERES 14. Rue FAVART PARIS".

This beautiful poster is one of the best French posters from the early cinema that I have seen. Every aspect of the nativity is dramatized: the angels, the shepherds, the manger, the animals, the star, the Magi. The infant Jesus, Mary and Joseph are bathed in golden light that shines mysteriously from within the manger.

The poster has been cleaned and linen-backed with minor touch up. The film was distributed in the United States, both by Pathe and by Eclectic Film Company. The U.S. title of the film is THE LIFE OF OUR SAVIOUR or THE PASSION PLAY and the year of import is 1914. Very nice condition for a poster over a century old.
