

## Wizard of Oz Half Sheet Leads Heritage Auctions' Movie Posters Auction to Above \$2 Million

Posters from horror classics also spark active bidding among eager collectors

DALLAS, Texas (March 27, 2019) — Numerous collectors drove the final result for a <u>The Wizard of Oz</u> (MGM, 1939) Half Sheet Style <u>A</u> to \$108,000, well beyond its high pre-auction estimate, to help lead Heritage Auctions' <u>Movie Posters</u> <u>auction</u> beyond the \$2 million

plateau. The sale, held March 23-24 in Dallas, realized a final total of \$2,037,626, and boasted sellthrough rates of 98.7 percent by value and 97.1 percent by lots sold.



The top lot is one of seven posters in the sale

commemorating the legendary musical fantasy film that was produced on a total budget of approximately \$2.7 million (in Depression-era dollars), but earned just over \$3 million at the box office – a paltry return on the investment. It wasn't until it was shown on television in 1956 that the film enjoyed renewed popularity and became one of the most popular films of all time and, not coincidentally, became one of the most collected titles in the movie posters collecting hobby.

"The *Wizard of Oz* is a timeless classic that has become a beloved tradition for generations of fans," Heritage Auctions Vintage Posters Director Grey Smith said. "The rarity and exceptional condition of this half sheet, from one of the most popular films ever made, make it a potential centerpiece for any serious collection."

<u>The Wolf Man (Universal, 1941) Insert</u> is another that sparked enough eager bidding to drive the final result to well beyond the pre-auction estimates, finishing at \$96,000. Because of financial troubles, there was talk during the 1940s that Universal Studios might cease making horror films – a temptation that was resisted upon the realization that horror films were the only ones sure to turn a profit. The classic depicted on this insert, one of the rarest posters made to promote the film, effectively revived the studio's horror cycle for another decade and made star Lon Chaney, Jr., into the studio's new star.

More than a dozen collectors made bids for <u>The Bride of Frankenstein (Universal, 1935)</u> <u>Insert</u> until it brought \$90,000. The film shines a spotlight on a film considered among the most important ever made in the horror genre, despite the fact that director James Whale initially had no interest in directing the sequel to his 1931 classic, *Frankenstein*. Despite his dismissive approach to the film, which included layers of dark comedy, it enjoyed enormous success and popularity with audiences, opened to rave reviews and was heralded as Whale's "second masterpiece." This insert is one of the most desirable posters in Universal's horror franchise, and one of very few copies known to remain in existence.

<u>Casablanca (Warner Brothers, 1942) Original Set Continuity Photos</u> nearly doubled its high pre-auction estimate when it drew a final sale price of \$55,200. The film is revered among fans as one of the best ever made, and features legendary stars Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman. Set continuity photos like these ensure that audiences remain focused on the action and plot, rather than on misplaced props, and allow the crew to reset for multiple takes significantly easier. Scenes found within this album include Rick's Café, the Blue Parrot, Rick's office and the café in Paris, as well as exterior shots of the marketplace in Casablanca, the train station in Lyon and the Palais de Justice.

#### An exceedingly rare Nosferatu (PranaFilm, 1921) German Magazine Promotional

<u>Ad</u> soared past pre-auction estimates when more than a dozen collectors made bids, before ultimately selling for \$52,800. When director F.W. Murnau chose to make a film version of Bram Stoker's *Dracula* nine years after the author's death, he did not consider that Stoker's widow owned the rights to his works and relied on them as her lone source of income. So when Murnau made *Nosferatu* (based on *Dracula*) without her permission, she sued him for all copies of the film, most of which she destroyed.



After barely getting released in 1922, it reemerged in 1930 with a new title, *The Twelfth Hour*, and even featured characters who had been renamed as part of the effort to hide the film from Stoker's attorneys. Original posters and advertising material of any kind for the film are virtually impossible to find, explaining the demand for this German rarity.

Dear Friends & Movie Lovers:

As always, some great new acquisitions this month but first I want to acknowledge the passing of the wonderful Agnes Varda, who died March 29th at the age of 90. Varda began making films in the 1950's - a time when it was nearly impossible for a female director to be taken seriously. Just as miraculously, she was able to sustain a major career over the next six decades, all the while telling the stories she wanted to tell. Over the years, the subjects, structures, forms and style of her films changed significantly, but each was unmistakably hers.



The past few years saw a major, much-deserved and altogether delightful Varda renaissance, including her honorary Oscar and an Oscar nod for FACES/PLACES. In February, she appeared at the Berlin film festival with her final film and received an award.

In late January, I saw Agnes at an event for film fans and collectors. It was very low-key, held in an unfashionable suburb of Paris, and Agnes wasn't making any kind of official appearance - she was just there visiting a friend and hanging out with the rest of us movie-lovers. That tiny woman with the pixie haircut, a formidable, inspirational artist - open and engaged to the end. Click on the posters or **here** to see our Varda collection.

# **Bye Bye Birdie**: Movie Review by Brandy Isadora



**Bye Bye Birdie** was originally a popular Broadway production and Tony award winner in the early 1960's. In 1963, the play was adapted to film, starring Dick Van Dyke and Janet Leigh. Ann-Margret and rock n' roll singer, Bobby Rydell, also star in the musical comedy. Director George Sidney and Producer Fred Kohlmar created a film that is perfect for the whole family to watch. Bye Bye Birdie is funny, intelligent, and heartfelt. The music is memorable and catchy, and the portrayal of the high school teens in early 1960's America is so innocent that some of the younger viewers might catch themselves chuckling. The idea for the play and the film came from the meteoric rise of Elvis Presley and his draft into the army. The movie was supposed to really highlight Van Dyke and Leigh, but Ann- Margret was so captivating with her red hair, beauty, and charisma that she became the focus in the movie. In fact, the opening and closing numbers for the movie were added because of Ann-Margret's captivating personality.

The plot of the movie centers around the rock n' roll star Conrad Birdie (Jesse Pearson) and his draft into the military. Young girls all over the country are losing their minds that they are losing Birdie. Struggling music writer Albert (Van Dyke) and his girlfriend, Rosie (Leigh), decide that they must find a way to convince Ed Sullivan to have Birdie perform his farewell show



and sing one of Albert's songs. Rosie suggests that one lucky girl will be chosen to get a kiss from the rock legend before he heads off to the military. The young woman who wins the contest is a high school girl named Kim McAfee (Ann-Margret). To say that Kim is elated would be an understatement, but her boyfriend, Hugo (Rydell), is less than pleased. He is bound and determined to stop her from getting swept away by the rock star.

Everyone involved pins their hopes and dreams on Birdie's final appearance. Albert dreams that this will ignite his career, and Rosie hopes that Albert will ask to marry her after he achieves the success he needs. Kim basks in her sudden popularity as Sweet Apple, Ohio's darling. However, ideas don't always go according to plan. Albert's intrusive mother repeatedly undermines his relationship with Rosie. Birdie's wild behavior and hard partying upset the McAfee family and alarm the small town of Sweet Apple. While the storyline isn't particularly complex or unique, the music in this film is brilliant. Composed by Charles Strouse with lyrics by Lee Adams, every song is either touching or funny. "A Lot of Livin' to Do" is one of the sexiest numbers without being raunchy. The audience gets a taste of both Birdie's and Kim's undeniable onscreen charisma. One of the most comical numbers is "Kids," with Kim's father and Albert's mother commiserating about the "sacrifices" they make for their ungrateful children. Comedian Paul Lynde played the role of Kim's father, Harry McAfee. Lynde's comic timing make his character memorable even though it's a much smaller role. Maureen Stapleton performed the role of Albert's mother, though in reality Stapleton was only about five months older than Dick Van Dyke. Like Lynde, Stapleton is unforgettable in her role as the intrusive and manipulative mother. Truly, there are no

insignificant roles in this movie because there are no wasted scenes. Every line has a purpose and contributes to the larger story.

Bye Bye Birdie didn't set any records or make history, but a great film doesn't have to be number one. The movie had a fun story, a great cast, and incredible music. Sometime a good film is one that provides a temporary escape from the doldrums of reality. Though the world looks much different now than it did in the early '60s, Bye Bye Birdie will probably remain relevant for long time because it's great entertainment.

Before the **SPRING COLLECTION** is unveiled in 2 weeks, I wanted to glorify one of the most beautiful women and actresses) <u>Sharon Tate</u>, whose memory and sensuality are honored in Tarantino's new movie, *Once Upon A Time In Hollywood*, in which she is "embodied" by Margot Robbie.

Her supersonic career was sadly stopped by her savage murder in 1969 at the young age of 26, while she was pregnant, by 3 goons from the Charles Manson cult..

Oracles could have predicted this bad omen as the number 13 - who some say is an unlucky one - has bookended her short career (9 years and 11 movies and TV movies). Indeed her first major feature film was titled Thirteen (retitled Eye Of The Devil) and her last was the Franco-Italian comedy, 12 + 1!!!

A fatal beauty, Sharon Tate won many Teen beauty contests in Italy where she lived her teenage years (her father, a soldier was stationed there) and where she also shot her first movie, *Barabbas*, as well as in the USA where she came back in 1961 to head straight to Hollywood.

Autre small minor roles in various TV series, she landed her first major role in the aforementioned Thirteen in 1967, a glorious year where she filmed no less than 4 movies and when she fell in love with <u>Roman Polanski</u> on the set of <u>The Fearless Vampire Killers</u> movie which revealed her to the world. Sharon Tate instantly became Hollywood's "It Girl" as her power couple with Polanski propelled her to the higher echelons of stardom. Her salary jumped from \$750 per week in early 1967 to reach \$150,000 for he last two movies in 1969!!!

The 4 mythical US concert venues from the Sixties were the Fillmore and the Avalon Ballroom (Family Dog) in San Francisco, the Grande Ballroom in Detroit and the Boston Tea Party in Boston. The latter gave us many fantastic concert posters, all printed in very limited quantity, such as the one for <u>Fleetwood Mac</u>'s 1970 shows.

<u>Ursula Andress</u> and <u>Marcello Mastroianni</u> were one of the most dazzling on screen couples in what I consider to be the most visually creative movie of the Sixties, i.e. <u>The Tenth Victim (La decima vittima)</u>, the Italian futuristic thriller from 1965.

The rare US one sheet poster of <u>Performance</u>, the erotic and violent British thriller starring <u>Mick Jagger</u>, at his darkest and most depraved.

More colored and aesthetic is one of the 24 posters designed by Otl Aicher for the <u>1972 Munich</u> <u>Olympics Games</u>. This one is for the cycling competitions.

Colors always with the complete set of 8 Italian fotobusta posters printed for the original release of <u>Moon Zero Two</u>, the Sci-Fi/Western produced by Hammer Films in 1969.

More gorgeous women with 3 Italian posters created between 1951 and 1955 for the cosmetic brand <u>Paglieri</u>. The posters are sold separately and are linen backed. 33





Childhood memories with the rare style C Japanese poster for the movie adapted from the 1982 manga/ anime series <u>Space Adventure Cobra</u>.



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
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
