James Bond 007 - 'A Time To Buy' November 20, 2020, 12:00pm

Athough Ian Fleming did not provide James Bond with a birth date, John Pearson's official fictional biography of the agent does, and it turns out that 007 would have turned 100 on November 11th, 2020.

Coinciding with this milestone and the recent passing of legendary actor Sean Connery, Ewbank's Auctions is holding its <u>James Bond 007 - A Time to Buy</u> auction on November, 20, 2020 at 12:00 p.m. UK time.

This auction is offering a great selection of Connery posters, including several from the 1962 film Dr. No which introduced Connery as Bond:

As a Bond aficionado, Ewbank's specialist Alastair McCrea is in regular contact with a network of influential collectors seeking rare film posters, props and costumes associated with the long-lasting series of films that now stretch back almost 60 years.

Here are his top ten tips for buying Bond (<u>artsandcollections.com</u>)

- 1. The most valuable Bond memorabilia tends to be from the Sean Connery era.
- 2. Purchase from reputable sources when a novice buyer.
- 3. Provenance is key, if you can prove something has starred in one of the movies it will make a big difference.
- 4. Research the item you are buying, look for other realised prices to get an idea of what it is worth.
- 5. Speak to experts, whether a fan forum or specialist they are often happy to give you extra information.
- 6. Even if you can't afford to spend big there are many lower value items that increase in value, a good place to start is the 007 website.
- 7. Decide what area you want to collect whether it be posters, toys, autographs or props. There is so much breadth to James Bond collectibles.
- 8. Try to collect authentic pieces rather than replicas.
- 9. Collect what you like rather than always concentrating on investment.
- 10. Enjoy it!

CINEMA POSTER AUCTION NOVEMBER 20, 2020, 4 PM CET

Aste Bolaffi for the second appointment of the year with Cinema Posters is glad to present a catalogue of 274 lots entirely dedicated to the seventh art.

This is a very rich and varied selection of materials from important private Italian collections.

The first section is dedicated to Silent Movies, and puts on sale some important posters in large format never appeared before on the market, among which the rare examples made by Martinati and Corbella for *Caius Julius Caesar* in 1914.

Then the rich catalogue offers some posters and playbills made by the major Italian designers such as Ballester, Ciriello, Nano, among which we would like to mention the re-edition of *Casablanca*.

The most interesting selection is the one concerning the film career material of one of Hollywood's most famous and beloved actresses, the divine Audrey Hepburn, whose filmography is represented here almost in full. From an important private collection in Milan, in fact, posters in different formats, playbills, lobby cards, half-sheets, inserts and window cards have emerged.



Among all the most important lots are those relating to the masterpiece **Breakfast at** *Tiffany's*, but many important lots designed by Nano and Brini, will also be sold at auction, as some sketches and posters by Lorenzo and Giuliano Nistri.

The catalogue closes with the first Italian edition of *Sleeping Beauty* by Walt Disney, dated 1959, a 4-sheet that will fascinate adults and children alike.

Gorgeous Large-Scale Casablanca Poster Headed to Heritage Auctions

Event also spotlights Hollywood's 'Eighth Wonder of the World' in King Kong gem

DALLAS, Texas (November 5, 2020) — An extraordinary Casablanca six sheet could bring \$300,000 when it comes to auction in Heritage Auctions' <u>Movie Posters</u> <u>Auction</u> Nov. 21-22.

One of just a handful of copies known to remain in existence, the <u>Casablanca (Warner</u> <u>Bros., 1942) Six Sheet</u> (estimate: \$150,000-300,000) is an undeniable treasure for collectors of elite movie posters. There are design similarities between this poster and the Style B half sheet for Michael Curtiz's beloved classic film, but the portraits on this poster are of a quality unmatched on any of the other American posters.



"The artwork and color on this poster are exceptional, and that is only magnified by the sheer scale of this masterpiece, which measures nearly eight feet in each direction," Heritage Auctions Vintage Posters Director Grey Smith said. "The dominant images are of two storied actors, Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman, in their most famous roles. When you have such legendary actors in a timeless classic, featured on a poster as artistic as this one, the demand among serious collectors really takes off."

The original king of monsters makes an appearance when a <u>King Kong (RKO, 1933) Three</u> <u>Sheet Style B</u> (estimate: \$125,000-250,000) is offered by Heritage Auctions for just the second time ever.

The film holds incredible importance in the history of moviemaking: Merian C. Cooper and Ernest B. Schoedsack created a tragic version of the *Beauty and the Beast* narrative that has captivated audiences for generations. The pair incorporated groundbreaking technological innovations, the most important of which was the work of stopmotion animator Willis O'Brien, whose skilled treatment of Kong and Skull Island's dinosaurs kept viewers' suspension of disbelief in check and thus raised the status of the picture to a true classic.

The offered poster is a visual triumph and one of the rarest three sheets in the hobby, thanks to its vibrant stone litho illustration of Kong rampaging about New York City.

Original paper from Charlie Chaplin's first feature-length film as a director and star is exceedingly rare, making this <u>The Kid (First National,</u> <u>1921) Three Sheet</u> (estimate: \$50,000-100,000) a collector's prize.

The film marked Chaplin's transition from shorts to full-length films, and also featured his ability to intertwine comedy, emotional drama and social commentary on poverty and the inadequacies of child welfare services. As one of the first to blur the line between comedy and tragedy, it forever altered the cinematic storytelling process. Chaplin's impactful performance is often credited with the loss of his own newborn child, who died only 10 days before filming began. His personal tragedy, combined with the charms of child vaudevillian Jackie Coogan, cemented The Kid as one of the greatest films of the silent era.

A *The Mummy* (Universal, 1932) Pre-War Belgian (estimate: \$40,000-80,000) bears some significant resemblance to the equally gorgeous American one sheet. After bursting into the spotlight with his performance in *Frankenstein*, Boris Karloff triumphs in his second role, in a performance that helped boost Universal's horror film genre, prompting a slew of sequels, remakes and crossover appearances over the ensuing decades.

The poster lacks the studio's distributor logo, but it can be traced to Universal's original European distribution because of the mention above the title of Max Bosman, who had been in charge of the publicity department at Universal's Dutch office, beginning five years before the release of the film. He undoubtedly played an active role in advertising films across Holland's border into Belgium, making this one-of-a-kind poster an authentic part of Universal's 1933 release.

Another all-time classic, which helped solidify Universal's status with the horror genre, grabs the spotlight in Dracula (Universal, R-1938) One Sheet (estimate: \$35,000-70,000). By 1938, Universal had created several horror films that had achieved financial success for the studio as well as cult status with the public. It was time to introduce a new generation of filmgoers to the original horror shows that started it all: Frankenstein and Dracula.

The studio released its first reissue of *Dracula* with green tinting on some of the film prints, and subsequently printed a one sheet that used the same dark greens and black to make the image of Bela Lugosi more menacing. The image of Lugosi is strikingly similar to the original style A one sheet, and no other copies of this 1938 rerelease one sheet have surfaced. This copy emerged in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, and only when acquired by a collector was its true value recognized as one of the most atmospheric horror posters, capturing Lugosi in his most important role, as Dracula, one of the most famous icons of the cinema.

UPCOMING REGULATION CHANGES FOR BUSINESSES SELLING TO THE UK

LAMP Sponsor John Reid of <u>Moviemem Original Movie Posters</u> shared with us this notification that he received from the Australia Post:

Upcoming regulation changes for businesses selling to the UK

Dear John,

I'm writing as a courtesy to advise of some changes to United Kingdom (UK) customs regulations that are soon to be introduced as a result of the UK leaving the European Union. All sellers, including online retailers, sellers on marketplaces and international businesses selling directly to UK consumers by phone or mail order, are likely to be impacted by these changes.

From 1 January 2021, the value-added tax (VAT) applicable to commercial items valued at $\pounds 15 - \pounds 135$ entering the UK will now be expanded to $\pounds 0 - \pounds 135$ (inclusive), meaning the £15 lower limit is abolished. The VAT on these items will also now have to be pre-paid.

If you sell goods to customers in the UK, from January 2021 you'll need to pre-pay VAT to avoid additional costs. To do this, you'll need to ensure you have:

- a GB Economic Operator Registration and Identification (EORI) number before shipping your goods
- the HS Tariff Code required to make a customs declaration and calculate duties on an import
- the customs value of goods needed to make a customs declaration and calculate duties on import.

We recommend you prepare for the application of the VAT scheme to your business by considering the changes and where appropriate <u>applying for an EORI number</u> in advance. It can take up to a week to get one, so register early.

Please read through the additional information and useful links on <u>our website</u>, to see how these changes may affect your business. You'll also find the <u>latest international delivery times</u> and our <u>last sending dates to deliver for your customers in time for Christmas</u>.

As always, we continue to review our estimated delivery times on auspost.com.au, and we'll advise you of any important delays or improvements to the network.

ANTIQUES UNDER THE HAMMER Thunderbirds Are Go



SALEROOM SPOTLIGHT

A hidden archive of models, props, scenery and scripts linked to the Anderson franchise that has come to light after more than 30 years goes under the hammer in Surrey this month

f you're nostalgic for the TV shows of your youth, the name Gerry Anderson is likely to feature strongly in your memory. Whether you were a child of the 1960s – when you might have been glued to *Stingray*, *Thunderbirds* or *Captain Scarlet* – or the '70s (when *Space: 1999* and *Joe 90* were TV gold) you will be no stranger to the world of Supermarionation – the word used by Anderson to describe the puppetry technique used extensively in his television shows.

Now a huge archive of items from the Anderson franchise, thought to have been lost, has come to light after more than 30 years. It was removed from Bray Studios after Anderson's production company wrapped up its final series of *Terrahawks* in the mid 1980s. The archive became the property of Julian Bell, a driver and handyman at the studios who was given it by one of the senior directors acting under Anderson's authority because they had no storage facilities for it.

Production puppets, models of aircraft and other machinery, sets, Gerry Anderson's personally annotated scripts and even storyboards for a series of *Thunderbirds* that was never filmed are included in the consignment, which will go under the hammer in a dedicated auction expected to raise up to \$150,000 on November 30 at Ewbank's Auctions in Woking.

ICONIC TELLY

Much of the collection is linked to the 1980s *Terrahawks* series, but *Captain Scarlet*, *Thunderbirds* and other hit programmes from the Anderson stable are also represented.

There have been rumours among the fanbase for years that the *Terrahawks* production pieces survived, but no one really knew what had happened to them. Bell, who died in 2019, hinted that he had a lot of it a few years ago, but the trail went cold.

Setting the discovery in context is important to understanding its impact.

The way that Gerry Anderson and his teams made the programmes means that a great deal of the props, models and sets from series like *Thunderbirds*, *Stingray* and *Fireball XL5* never survived.

Super fan David Sisson, who spent 35 years building replica models and restoring original studio props from the shows, said: "There'll be a lot of interest. For fans it's always been the saddest aspect of the Anderson programmes that Gerry never kept anything. *Terrahawks* has a growing appreciation from the younger generation of Anderson fans. When I do my public displays, a lot of these people recognise *Terrahawks* even when they don't recognise *Thunderbirds*."

He continued: "Because Anderson worked with puppets and did the voices later, he didn't need a sound stage, so he rented warehouses, but the ceaseless weekly production of new puppets, models, and sets

meant that this available space filled up rapidly and disposing of items that could not be reused, or repurposed, became a constant problem.

"Gerry was always ready to move on to the next project and so needed the sets cleared, so he used to give everything away or have it thrown out."

HIGHLIGHTS

It is ironic that, despite the huge demand for puppets, models and other memorabilia from the Anderson programmes today, the man himself never seemed to care about them.

David Sisson said: "The one thing he did keep for many years was a Parker puppet from the original *Thunderbirds* series."

The fact that Julian Bell preserved so much of the original production material for so long without trying to sell it means that there has been little chance so far to test the market for *Terrahawks*, he added.

David continued: "It's like travelling back in time. I expect the hero craft to be the big sellers. The Battlehawk is the prize piece, along with Hawkwing and Treehawk, but this is really completely untested ground. What makes this auction so special is that there will never be another chance to see everything together in one place. Once it's sold it will be spread around the world and never be together again. You really can't overstate how special this is going to be."

We asked Ewbank's memorabilia specialist Alastair McCrea for his sale highlights

How important is the collection?

Simply put, this is one of the largest and most important consignments ever made of studio production used models, figures and scripts from Gerry Anderson programmes ever uncovered. Added to which we have clear provenance back to when it was all cleared post production from Bray Studios in the mid 1980s. It is mainly Terrahawks items, which are really popular with today's collectors. What makes this especially interesting is that the fanbase has talked for years about where all of this went to and whether it was rescued or destroyed. It's been privately held for over 30 years and now Ewbank's can solve the mystery.

Considering so much Anderson production material ended up in skips to make way for the next project, this is close to being a miraculous survival.

Do you have a personal highlight?

Aside from *Terrahawks*, the collection includes other rare material, most notably an electronic puppet head from the original 1960s *Captain Scarlet* programmes. Although a rather minor character, the model of Captain Ochre, is incredibly rare and has the estimate of £5,000-£8,000.

Intriguingly, there are also rarely-seen puppets and props from a series Anderson created called *Space Police*. It dated to the mid-1980s and only one episode was ever made which was never screened on TV. This will be the first opportunity for fans to see these very rare pieces.

Where is interest likely to come?

We expect to attract bidders from all over the world via live online bidding on our website. The archive has been the talk of legend among fans for decades because no one really knew what happened to it and whether anything was rescued. This month's auction finally solves the mystery.

Painted Japanese Yakuza movie posters are rarer and very hard to find as printed in much smaller quantities than the standard posters.

Sean Connery spent most of his last years enjoying the climate of the Bahamas where he could play Golf. This insert sized Italian poster for <u>Flame Of The Islands</u> seems therefore appropriate. The gorgeous painting of the woman by <u>Roldofo Gasparri</u> is directly 'lifted' from a pulp book cover by <u>Robert McGinnis</u> who is THE most famous Bond poster Artist ever.

Sean Connery is one of many Britons who found fame in the US. Staying on the West Coast, we just celebrated <u>Joni</u> <u>Mitchell</u>'s 77th birthday so it's natural we feature THE greatest female singer-songwriter ever with a vintage half sheet poster for the 1969 concert / documentary <u>Celebration At Big Sur</u> co-starring the cream of the West Coast music scene.



Sadly Sean Connery never co-starred with <u>Clint Eastwood</u> which is a shame as they would surely have out-done each other with coolness and killing ruthlessness. Here is Clint with a beautiful brand new limited edition print by Casey Callender titled <u>Man With No Name</u>.









How I wish that <u>Isaac Hayes</u>, the giant of Soul Music, a genial composer/arranger/singer/entertainer who ruled the Hit making business between 1969 and 1975, had created one of James Bond's songs/scores. Nevertheless at the height of his fame, he branched into acting at the top of the <u>Blaxploitation</u> craze with classics like <u>Truck Turner</u>. Vintage US one sheet poster.

Academy Museum Gives Debbie Reynolds Her Due as a Costume Conservator

For decades, Debbie Reynolds begged Hollywood to help her preserve and exhibit her vast collection of golden age costumes. "These pieces are cultural touchstones that still carry the energy of the stars who performed in them," she once said, referring to legends like Elizabeth Taylor and Judy Garland. "There is magic in every thread, button and bow."



The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences turned her down — five times. Reynolds quoted an uninterested David Geffen in her 2013 memoir as once saying, "Why don't you just sell that stuff?" In debt, she finally had no other choice, auctioning Marilyn Monroe's ivory-pleated halter dress that blew upward in "The Seven Year Itch" for \$4.6 million and Audrey Hepburn's lace Royal Ascot number from "My Fair Lady" for \$3.7 million — prices that shocked moviedom's aristocracy and proved Reynolds had been right. Also sold, in some cases to anonymous overseas collectors, were Charlton Heston's "Ben-Hur" tunic and cape, the acoustic guitar Julie Andrews strummed in "The Sound of Music" and every hat that Vivien Leigh flaunted in "Gone With the Wind."Hollywood didn't give a rattling.

Hollywood didn't give a damn.

Now, four years after she <u>died at 84</u>, there has been a plot twist in the Debbie Reynolds costume collection saga, one that she would undoubtedly find both maddening and satisfying: <u>The Academy</u> <u>Museum of Motion Pictures</u>, set to open on April 30 and costing \$482 million, finds itself caring about her collection — at least the part that is left, which includes iconic costumes she wore in movies like "Singin' in the Rain." Also remaining are screen garments created for Mary Pickford, Deborah Kerr and Cyd Charisse, as well as rare memorabilia from classics like "The Wizard of Oz" and "The Maltese Falcon."
