The late Michael Armstrong was such a film fanatic that when the local cinema closed in his home town in 1993, he opened his own mini replica in his garage, complete with recycled fixtures and fittings.

Armstrong, of Wymondham, Norfolk, then established <u>The Regal Experience</u>, a sell-out Sunday afternoon film show that attracted many of

the stars who appeared in the films, including June Whitfield and Virginia McKenna. These events, helped by friends, were used to raise money for charity.

Five Records Set in \$2.2 Million Heritage Movie Posters Auction

Dracula artwork brings \$78,000 as event's top lot

DALLAS, Texas (March 31, 2021)

— A piece of original art featuring the most famous vampire in the history of film and literature soared to nearly four times its high pre-auction estimate to lead Heritage Auctions' Movie Posters Auction to \$2,224,433 in total sales April 27-28.

Five world records were set in the event, which drew nearly 1,800 bidders and boasted sellthrough rates of 96.1% by lots sold and 94.9 by value sold.

Dracula by Basil Gogos (2002) Signed Original Acrylic Artwork on Canvas drew nearly two dozen bids before it reached \$78,000, against a high preauction estimate of \$20,000, to claim top-lot honors. The one-ofa-kind image of Bela Lugosi as Count Dracula, offered for the first time at Heritage Auctions, comes from the artist who gained his fame largely by illustrating magazine covers for Famous Monsters of Filmland, including Frankenstein's Monster, the Phantom of the Opera, the Mummy, the Wolf Man, the Gill Man, King Kong and Bram Stoker's infamous count.

"This is extraordinary artwork for one of the most popular and important films in the horror genre," Heritage Auctions Vintage Posters Director Grey Smith said. "It's a powerful, dramatic image from an important artist known as one of the best at creating movie monsters."

Lots that set new world records included:

\$55,200: The War of the Worlds (Paramount, 1953) Half Sheet Style B is quite possibly the best and most well-preserved half sheet for the film, one of the most popular titles among sci-fi collectors, ever offered through Heritage Auctions. Posters for the film, including this style B half sheet, are notorious for their spectacular graphics; this one is one of very few U.S. posters to show the Martian war machines.

\$52,800: A Werewolf of London (Universal, 1935) Title Lobby Card comes from one of the top horror movies of all time, the first werewolf story in a feature film. This rare title card show the title character after makeup artist Jack Pierce's work was toned down to reveal more of Henry Hull's actual appearance, the end result of which was the title character with which film fans are so familiar.

\$28,800: <u>Help!</u> (United Artists, 1965) Door Panel Set of 4 is a rare quartet of door panels for the Beatles' second film, and the only set produced for any of the band's films. Door panels rare were ordered by theater owners, because so many venues had no place to display them and because of

\$26,401.20: An Attack of the 50 Foot Woman (Allied Artists, 1958) One Sheet with Reynold Brown Artwork is one of the most readily identifiable images of 1950s sci-fi. The film has grown in popularity in mainstream pop culture, making its posters coveted must-have items for sci-fi collectors.


\$6,000: A Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban (Warner Bros., 2004) Lenticular Standee, depicting Harry Potter's godfather, Sirius Black

A Citizen Kane (RKO, 1941) One Sheet Style A, from the film that has been called the best movie of all time, more than tripled its low pre-auction estimate when it finished at \$45,600. Heritage Auctions has offered only a few style A one sheets from the classic that earned nine Academy Award nominations, including Best Picture, Best Director and Best Actor.



An exceedingly rare *Horse Feathers* (Paramount, 1932) Three Sheet drew a winning bid of \$40,800. This extraordinary stone litho three sheet, now almost 90 years old, captures the Marx Brothers in one of their funniest Paramount films, in which Groucho is the new president of Huxley College, which has not won a football game in more than 40 years.

A Casablanca (Warner Bros., 1942) One Sheet more than doubled its low pre-auction estimate when it brought \$36,000. It trumpets Michael Curtiz's landmark film that was nominated or eight Academy Awards and won three, and elevated Julius and Phillip Epstein's bittersweet tale into a piece of cinema legend.

A Casablanca (Warner Bros., 1942) Half Sheet Style B reached \$33,600. From one of the most popular films ever made, the Style B half sheet is among the film's most popular posters, widely accepted as the more desirable of the two half sheet styles produced for the film. The focus is on the portraits of Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman in their most beloved roles, and includes images of five of their co-stars: Paul Henreid, Claude Rains, Conrad Veidt, Peter Lorre and Hollywood newcomer Sydney Greenstreet.

Iconic WWII "Keep Calm and Carry On" Poster Auctioned for £13,000 at Ewbank's Recent Vintage Poster Auction

The "most famous of all war posters" wowed antiques experts with its A+ condition

An original of the iconic Keep Calm and Carry On posters produced during the Second World War sold for a staggering £13,000 at Ewbank's auctioneers March 27th Vintage Poster Auction.

The motivational wartime message was produced by the Government in 1939 as Britain faced the blitz and, while it was never actually used, became symbolic of the British "stiff upper lip." The bidding soared past the estimated £6,000-9,000 price.



Auctioneer and valuer Andrew Ewbank (above) said: "It's been an incredibly busy few days, with over 3,500 people registering to bid with us online, but the results have been worth all the hard work.

"It's fitting, in this extraordinary time we are living in, that the original 1939 Keep Calm and Carry On poster came out as the top lot of the series. The fantastic price is a tribute to its exceptional rarity and condition."

LAGNIAPPE AUCTION JOURNEY FROM DREAM TO REALITY

Chief Archivist Ed Poole spends a lot of time sorting the 750,000 items donated to Movie Poster Archives into three categories: Permanent Collection, Lagniappe Collection and General Inventory.

Donations are initially placed in General Inventory until they can be assessed by Ed, one of the world's leading authorities on movie posters and paper. His sharp eye can tell if a poster was issued by a studio or reprinted later for commercial distribution. He may pull out a ruler to check the size of the paper which tells him if it was printed in the U.S. or another country.

Although he can make quick decisions, he sometimes looks at dozens of characteristics such as watermarks or printer's marks on a dubious item.

A Zip code on a pre-1960s poster is a dead giveaway.



Lagniappe Auction
Launches to Great Response

After the initial assessment, the best example of each qualifying item is retained in the Permanent Collection.

Duplicates and reproductions, along with television, sports and celebrity photos, and oddities go into the Lagniappe Collection—extras to share with dealers, collectors, institutions, museums, and movie lovers.

Dealers from across the U.S., Great Britain and Canada have been purchasing Lagniappe since 2016.

Movie Poster Archives determined early on that an online auction was the best way to reach the public who wanted the Lagniappe Collection, but kept putting off the launch due to the expense of a quality platform and the daunting task of digitizing the collection.

The Covid-19 Pandemic and a grant from New Orleans Entertainment Coalition provided the time and funding to make the dream into a reality.

The successful March Lagniappe Auction was the first, but not the last. The May Lagniappe Auction will be held on May 12-19 offering prize titles and Disney memorabilia.


Moratorium on In-Kind Donations

It can get pretty wacky trying to manage 750,000 items. The gift from Herman, Herman and Katz of six lateral file cabinets has been put to good use.

Still, off-site storage had to be leased in late 2020 to make space for the Everett Collection donation of 160,000 archival-quality production stills.

As a result, a moratorium on accepting in-kind donations without prior approval has been declared.

LOUISIANA MOVIE POSTER VIRTUAL MUSEUM OPEN FOR ONLINE VISITORS

The digital doors of the Louisiana Movie Poster
Virtual Museum are open.
Ed and Susan Poole, renowned movie poster experts and authorities on Louisiana film history, curated this initial exhibit.

Since 1895 more than 3,000 movies have been made in or about Louisi-

The digital museum was inspired by Backdrop Loui-

siana! that debuted in January 2020 in collaboration with Hollywood on the Bayou.

Sue's extensive research is reflected in the poster descriptions. For instance, TIGHTROPE premiered at Lakeside Theater on August 16 1979 with proceeds from the premiere benefitting the Louisiana Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund per Clint Eastwood's request. The full descrip-

tion of KING CREOLE is featured on the last page of this newsletter.

Another special feature is that viewers can leave their own stories in the Comments on the Description tab for each poster.

The museum is funded in part by grants from the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Foundation and the New Orleans Entertainment Coalition.

THE EVERETT FAMILY OF DONORS

"A poster from every English -speaking film ever made." The history of Movie Poster Archives begins with a conversation between Chief Archivist Ed Poole and renowned collector Morris Everett, Jr.

Morrie was looking for a nonprofit focused on the preservation of movie posters.

As a young man, Morrie set out to collect a poster from every English-speaking film ever made. His valiant effort led to a multi-million item collection, including over two million movie stills. His hobby of buying and selling posters gave rise to the Hollywood Poster Auction and the Everett Collection which rivals the Getty Images for licensing images.

In 2016, a small portion of Morrie's collection was sold at auction by Profiles in History for nearly \$8 million.

Morrie was the first in-kind

donor to Movie Poster Archives and has recruited his family and business associates. too.

Morrie celebrated his 80th birthday in December 2020 and is actively selling online these days on eBay and the Hollywood Poster Auction.

It's safe to say that in-kind donations from the Everett family of donors are the foundation of the Archives.

NEW ORLEANS ENTERTAINMENT COALITION

When MPA executive director Linda Thurman needed a sponsor for the historic marker for Vitascope Hall, the first movie theater in America, she turned to Sandra and Russ Herman.

Friends for many years, she knew Sandra is a lover of culture, history and art. After all. Sandra created the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism and served as its first secretary.

She soon learned that Sandra's husband, prominent attorney Russ M. Herman had produced a film while a student at Tulane. Russ discovered Gerald McRaney there, casting him

in his first film role.

As CEO of New Orleans Entertainment Coalition, Sandra uses her power for good to approve much-needed grants that make programs like the Louisiana Movie Poster Virtual Museum and the online Lagniappe Auction series possible.

WORD OF THE WEEK IS COLLECTIBLE



Collectible is a loaded word for movie poster enthusiasts. Dealers and many collectors reserve the term for original, studio or distributor issued posters, lobby cards, production stills, and pressbooks. They disdain the commercial reprints (think Walmart) and reproductions prized by fans and so popular for décor.

The key is to know what you want and what you're getting.

If you're decorating a home theater or man cave, reproductions are a great solution.

A film doesn't have to be great—or even good, to have a collectible poster.

LOUISIANA HUSSY is one example of a popular reproduction from the Hollywood on the Bayou collection. It's clearly marked to avoid fraud and available in the MPA Museum Gift Shop.

Investing in originals requires discernment. Even reputable dealers can be embarrassed by failing to detect fraud. Archivists Ed and Susan Poole have been expert witnesses in multimillion dollar movie poster fraud cases and know all the tricks.

The MPA Ouick Guide to Movie Posters is a good resource and it's FREE.

50 SHADES OF LOUISIANA: A FILMMAKERS PARADISE 2022 LIVE EXHIBIT

Since 1958 when the slogan first appeared on state license plates, Louisiana has been known as the Sportsman's Paradise. In the last twenty years, it has become heaven for movie makers.

Movie Poster Archives is planning a new live exhibit in 2022 called 50 Shades of Louisiana: A Filmmakers Paradise.

In addition to the usual written description hang-

ing nearby, augmented reality will let smartphone and tablets users open a short video featuring film trailers, clips, interview snippets, and more.



Augmented reality uses technology to superimpose images, text and sounds on top of what a person is actually seeing. A smartphone or tablet enhances the existing view, via an app. The user stands in front of a scene and holds up their device. It shows them an altered version of reality.

Like 2020's Backdrop Louisiana!, the exhibit will be in association with Hollywood on the Bayou. Ed and Susan Poole will serve as curators and produce the AR videos.

ELVIS PRESLEY IN KING CREOLE

A popular poster in the <u>Louisiana Movie Poster Virtual Museum</u> is the French Petite Reissue of Elvis Pressley in KING CREOLE.

The year was 1958 and there was no star bigger in entertainment than Mississippi's own Elvis Presley. With three films already under his belt, Presley was cast in the title role of Paramount Pictures KING CREOLE, a screenplay adapted from the Harold Robbins novel, A Stone for Danny Fisher. Producer Hal Wallis chose veteran CASABLANCA director Michael Curtiz to helm the film. Besides Presley, the cast included Carolyn Jones, Walter Matthau, Dolores Hart and Dean Jagger.

The story revolved around a 19-yearold delinquent, who, after flunking out of school, gets involved with the mob and women in the French Quarter of New Orleans.

KING CREOLE was the last picture Presley made before entering the U.S. Army to serve for two years. He had been drafted and ordered to report on January 20, 1958. Presley was given a 60-day deferment in order to shoot the film, on which Paramount had already spent approximately \$350,000 in preproduction costs.

So instead of reporting for Army duty, Presley, without his signature sideburns, boarded a train and arrived in New Orleans for location filming on March 1. 1958.

KING CREOLE was shot in part on location in New Orleans's French Quarter, Lake Pontchartrain, and a local high school. Cinematographer Russell Harlan photographed the film in a dark, moody lighting style that captured the seedy but seductive atmosphere of the French Quarter.

During location filming, Elvis had a major problem with fans mobbing him at The Roosevelt Hotel where he was staying. Hal Wallis arranged for heavyduty security so that Elvis could get enough rest to look fresh on camera. Pinkerton guards patrolled the hallways, the elevators, and even the fire escapes of the hotel to keep well-intentioned but troublesome fans away

When he returned to his hotel in the evening, Elvis had to go to the top of an adjacent building, cross over the

roof, and enter the Roosevelt by way of a fire escape.

He was unable to enjoy New Orleans celebrated night clubs or famous restaurants because of the persistence of his fans. Shooting in the city's streets was even worse. City policemen had to be used for crowd control.







Yes, Winter is way behind us even though temperatures oscillate between summer and winter on a daily basis leaving us all unsure what to wear when going out (for those of us who can freely do so without curfews!).

The **2021 SPRING POSTER COLLECTION** is close to being completed but its delay is due to the new "normal" postal chaos delivery with many items coming from Europe still blocked in customs (in the US or the departing country for 2 months) making me unable to take proper pictures and cataloging each items.


Many of you also experienced delays and the Gallery is doing its best to track every single package sent which may arrive - Russian roulette style - either in 3 days or in 2 months....!

So to keep you eagerly yet patiently waiting for the massive new collection, let's have a LAST look at the **2021 WINTER COLLECTION** still available in the <u>NEW</u> PRODUCTS section with another selection of 20 posters, eclectic and chic!



Winter is still here with many ski stations recording unusually high levels of snow so let's enjoy skiing with his rare Japanese poster printed to advertise the 1972 Sapporo Winter Olympics movie documentary with a slalom image. We have all the other styles.

But for those who prefer warmer pastures I always encourage you to fly to Hawaii, the islands of the gods, where nature is sublime..and so are the locals! as you can easily admire on the vintage 1970 Northwest Orient Airlines poster.



From Hawaii, we travel to Brazil with <u>Jean-Paul Belmondo</u> in one of my favorite films of his, <u>L'homme de Rio (That Man From Rio)</u> in which the jungle scene directly inspired Spielberg for the opening cave scene in Raiders Of The Lost Ark! The super rare Polish poster didn't bother archaeological exactitude as they switched Amazonian artifacts for an Angkor Wat temple statue!

Ken Takakura is another gigantic male star of World Cinema. In 1979 the New York Japan House introduced many movies of his during a retrospective and commissioned Japanese Pop Art superstar Tadanori Yokoo to design a poster which is now extremely hard to find.

Samurais directly inspired George Lucas in creating the <u>Star Wars</u> saga, the biggest movie franchise ever with legions of rabid fans. They gather every year since the early 00's for the Star Wars Celebration extravaganzas (rivaling any ComicCon) with several very limited edition prints designed specifically for those events. Here's one done by Mark Raats for <u>Star Wars Celebration 4</u> in 2007.

Celebrations are needed for birthdays especially for luminaries like <u>Federico</u> <u>Fellini</u> whose 100th birthday was feted in 2019. Many retrospectives were held around the world including in Berlin as shown with <u>this gorgeous German poster</u>.









German design again with another stunning example of the beauty of black and white that inspired Bauhaus and the German expressionist Art movement. Can't help but loving this vintage 1968 concert poster created for the Gospel group The Robert Patterson Singers' concerts.

We switch from heavenly music to spatial monstrosity with this limited edition print by Matt Griffin revisiting the first episode of the Alien saga.

The 2 above posters make me think about combining Hell and angels making it a very easy segue for this colorful portrait of <u>Jack Nicholson</u> sporting the 1976 Italian rerelease of <u>Hells Angels On Wheels</u>, the low-budget 1967 Bikers movie he shot before reaching worldwide fame.

Rather than motorbiking, let's fly supersonic with the legendary SR71 spy plane, used for some unknown reason to advertise the <u>Led Zeppelin</u>'s 1970 Salt Lake City concert. This poster has been bootlegged many times but we offer the super rare original.









Unlike Led Zeppelin, <u>Pink Floyd</u> ventured several times in the soundtrack composing field, creating scores for two Barbet Schroeder's movies, <u>More and Valley Obscured By The Clouds</u> reunited on this 2004 Japanese rerelease poster.

Jayne Mansfield is better known for her buxom / Va-Va-Voom figure than for her acting and her personal life was filled with drama ending tragically with her being beheaded in a car accident. Let's remember her Va-Va-Voomness with the impossible to find one sheet poster of the 1963 erotic movie, Promises Promises.

Sharon Tate is another Hollywood beauty who died tragically. Despite her very short filmography she keeps inspiring many visuals including this fabulous limited edition concert poster created for Primal Scream's 2015 Austin show.



The mid 60's are synonymous with James Bond inspired designs and plots inspiring the <u>Eurospy genre</u> with hundreds of films. The Italian posters for those movies are the best of the lot including this bondage themed one for <u>Agent 3S3 Passport To Hell</u>. Superb Art by <u>Mos (Mario de Berardinis)</u>.

Personally I prefer women being free and untied so they can unleash their natural beauty. Large French Grande poster for the 1975 Greek erotic movie, Strange Girl In Love.











From one addiction to another with this colorful large 1960 Swiss advertising poster for the <u>Java smoking tobacco brand</u>.

There's nothing wrong about feeling different as this rare day-glo card from the legendary 1971 Marvel Third Eye black light series proclaims. Art by Jack Kirby.

<u>Van Morrison</u> is one of my favorite musicians as he has the ability to transport the listeners to blissful places. Saw him tens of times but I had never seen one of his concerts which had a great poster before this fabulous limited edition print by Matt Taylor for the <u>2018 San Francisco shows</u>.


And because at the Gallery we love to collide the sacred and the deranged, what more deranged than this image for the Italian
