AN AGELESS PASSION FOR MOVIES



Our intern Alex Ryscavage reminded me this week that the love of movie posters is an ageless passion.

We were discussing topics for the videos that he'll be producing for our website and social media. I was excited about the thousands of new posters that have been donated this year.

Naively, I said, "We have one of my favorite movies *The River Wild*."

He said he hadn't seen it. Later I realized that the 1994 release date was before he was born. He did recognize the leads Meryl Streep and Kevin Bacon.

It wasn't clear if he knew David Straithairn who plays Streep's husband and (spoiler) the ultimate hero of the film.

I love this poster and this movie be-

cause it evokes a memory from my distant past. In 1983 in New York City, David Straithairn played "the Kid" in the play *Turnbuckle* written and directed by John Sayles. The *New York Times* credits me, Linda Thurman, as lighting designer.

During the production John Sayles said something that gave me the courage to make the move to film after a career in theatre. As I recall the conversation, I told him that I enjoyed *Piranha* (1978) and *The Howling* (1981), both of which he wrote.

He replied the he didn't like writing films but needed the money for his theater and personal film projects like *Return of the Secaucus Seven (1979).* Sayles continued to cast David Straithairn in films like *Passion Fish* (1988) and *Eight Men Out* (1992).

I treasure this memory and the chance to watch their careers over the years.

NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS AWARD

The National Endowment for the Arts awarded Movie Poster Archives a grant for 2021. Lt. Gov. Billy Nungesser announced the award for the Louisiana Office of Cultural Development and the Louisiana Division of the Arts.


He commented that the award recognized the significance of Movie Poster Archives added value to Louisiana's economy and the creative life of our community.

He went on to say "The arts are at the center of Louisiana's deeply-rooted culture."

Louisiana Division of the Arts Small Arts Organization CARES Relief Grant Award will be used for preservation and research of movie posters, lobby cards, production stills, and press kits.

"It's an honor to be recognized," according to Executive Director Linda Thurman who will administer the grant. "LEH grants are vital to the nonprofit community that supports art and artists."

Acting legend Charlton Heston came to New Orleans in 1969 to shoot the football themed movie Number One. Directed by Tom Gries, the film also starred Bruce Dern, Diana Muldaur and Jessica Walter. Local stars included the New Orleans Saints, Danny Abramowitz, Joe Wendryhoski, Mike Tilleman, Dave Rowe, Fred Whittingham, Jake Kupp and Del Williams as well as then Saints owner John Mecom. Local celebrities Al Hirt and Wayne Mack also appeared in the film.

The story revolved around Heston who played an aging quarterback of the New Orleans Saints who cannot accept the fact that his career is over. He wore the black and gold No. 17, the jersey of Saints current quarterback Billy Kilmer.

Location shooting in New Orleans took place October, November and December of 1968. The longdistance field and full stadium crowd scenes were real and were filmed during actual Saints games at Tulane Stadium, including the New Orleans vs. Dallas game that was played on November 3, 1968. A crowd of over 84,000, which was a record at that time, became a part of the film. While all of the distant quarterbacking scenes were of Saints quarterback Billy Kilmer in real action, the close-up scenes featuring Heston as quarterback were shot at Tulane Stadium before a crowd of "extras."

NUMBER ONE

A crew of over 75 also filmed movie sequences at St. Paul's School in Covington. The school had served as a week-long practice camp for the 1967 New Orleans Saints. Other shooting locales included the private home of New Orleans artist George Dunbar in Slidell; 629 Royal Street as the fictional Julie Millard jewelry shop; and Al Hirt's night club so that Al Hirt could play himself - a trumpet-player who is part owner of the team.

According to reports, Heston fractured a rib while rehearsing with his own crew and had to be taped for scenes shot the following day.

The world premiere of the film was held on August 21, 1969 at the Loew's State Theater to much fanfare.



Vintage Italian Movie Poster Art Classic Crime Thrillers, Exploitation Films & much more

Italian movie posters often have unique art that differs from the U.S. posters and often come in much larger sizes than standard 27" x 40" U.S. one sheet. An Italian 2-Folio, also called a "2 fogli" or "due-foglio" in Italy, measures 39" x 55". An Italian 4-Folio, also called a "4 fogli" or "quattro-foglio", are printed in two sections that overlap and measure 55" x 78". These oversized posters are stunning especially when displayed on a wall.

This week's collection features vintage Italian posters of a mixture of American (with some exceptions), crime, western, war, sci-fi and exploitation movies such as The Magnificent Seven, Truck Turner, Von Ryan's Express, Blade Runner and many more.
