From legendary director Howard Hawks, to the superb screenwriting team of Ben Hecht and Charles MacArthur, and the acting talents of the amazing John Barrymore and Carole Lombard, everything in this screwball romantic comedy "works" to perfection!!

While almost all first release one-sheets from **ALL** 1934 movies are frustratingly ultra-rare, one-sheets from **THIS** classic go far beyond that! In the 1970s, a collector purchased the Style B one-sheet offered here from another longtime collector, and at that point, it was the first one-sheet of either style that was known to have surfaced!

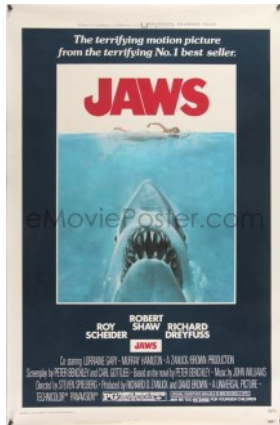

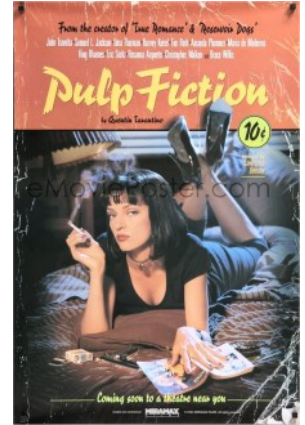

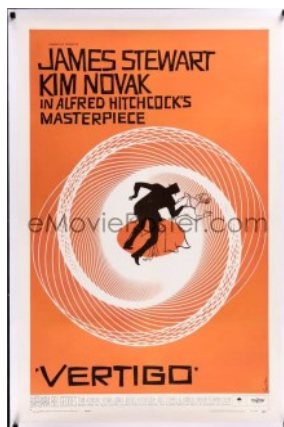

You might **THINK** that "consigning to auctions" is pretty much the same, and that how much money you receive is pretty much "the luck of the draw". But nothing could be further from the truth!

On 12/7/2023, another major auction company sold an example of the one-sheet from The Empire Strikes Back that has unedited Kastel art, and it sold for \$20,000. On 12/19/2023 (12 days later), our company, **eMoviePoster.com**, sold a different example of the one-sheet from The Empire Strikes Back that has unedited Kastel art, for \$21,500.

I am **NOT** bragging about the \$1,500 difference, because in the big scheme of things, getting a 7.5% difference in price is not that big a deal, and it **COULD** have gone either way. 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Dorothy's Ruby Slippers From 'The Wizard of Oz' Sell for \$32.5 Million at Heritage Auctions to Become World's Most Valuable Movie Memorabilia

The Wicked Witch's hat realizes \$2.93 million during \$38.6 million event that shatters record for a Hollywood and entertainment



DALLAS, Texas (Dec. 7, 2024) — [Dorothy's Ruby Slippers](#) sold Saturday at Heritage Auctions for a price somewhere over the rainbow, way up high: \$32.5 million.

One of four surviving pairs worn by Judy Garland in 1939's *The Wizard of Oz*, the slippers that sold Saturday are now the most famous — and, by far, the most valuable movie memorabilia ever sold at auction.

That single pair of shoes also helped Heritage's [December 7 Hollywood/Entertainment Signature® Auction](#) set the record for an entertainment auction: \$38,615,188. That shatters the \$22.8 million realized during the 2011 Debbie

Reynolds auction held by Heritage Auctions Executive Vice President Joe Maddalena.

“There is simply no comparison between Judy Garland’s Ruby Slippers and any other piece of Hollywood memorabilia,” Maddalena says. “The breathtaking result reflects just how important movies and movie memorabilia are to our culture and to collectors. It’s been a privilege for all of us at Heritage to be a part of the slippers’ epic journey over the rainbow and off to a new home.”

There were numerous star attractions spanning cinema’s rich history throughout this event, but none stood taller or shined brighter than the Technicolor treasures from *The Wizard of Oz*, which sparked a bidding war that lasted nearly as long as a walk down The Yellow Brick Road.

Live bidding opened at \$1.55 million.

Several thrilling minutes later, as bidding hit million-dollar increments, the slippers hit their final price, and the auction room erupted with applause. The pre-auction estimate for the slippers was \$3 million and up.

They surpassed that within seconds.

No other pair had ever come close to that final number.

One pair of Ruby Slippers sold at auction in 2000 for \$666,000. A dozen years later, Steven Spielberg and Leonardo DiCaprio spent \$2 million on the pair donated to the Academy Museum of Motion Pictures in Los Angeles. DiCaprio led the group of donors that allowed for the 2012 sale, which was brokered by Profiles in History, the auction house founded by Maddalena.

The pair that sold Saturday at Heritage was famously stolen from the Judy Garland Museum in Grand Rapids, Minn., in the summer of 2005; recovered 13 years later by the FBI; and [returned to owner Michael Shaw earlier this year](#) before he handed them over to Heritage for inclusion in the [December 7 Hollywood/Entertainment Signature® Auction](#), which drew more than 1,800 bidders worldwide.

Upon their recovery in 2018, the FBI took the slippers to the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History, where, the museum once noted, "smudges on the heavy glass vitrine must be routinely cleaned" because of the millions who "stand transfixed before them" each year. There, conservators compared them to the museum's pair donated in 1979. The FBI later said, "Examination of the recovered shoes showed that their construction, materials, and wear are consistent with the pair in the museum's collection."

Dorothy's slippers were designed by Gilbert Adrian, MGM's chief costume designer and made by Western Costume Company using white silk pumps from the Innes Shoe Company in Los Angeles.

Shaw's slippers were once known as "The Traveling Shoes" because of their long, storied exhibition history. The pair has since been renamed "The Stolen Pair" given the backstory that involved an elderly thief in ill health, 77-year-old Terry Jon Martin, who confessed in court documents last year to stealing the ruby slippers because he wanted to pull off "one last score."

Like the Ruby Slippers, the Wicked Witch's hat in this auction was part of Shaw's Hollywood on Tour during the 1980s and '90s. Shaw obtained it from legendary collector Kent Warner, who discovered the Ruby Slippers at the historic David Weisz Co. MGM Auction in 1970. Says Maddalena, who has handled more *Wizard of Oz* memorabilia and props than any other auctioneer, including Dorothy's blue dress and the Witch's hourglass: "This is the finest example of the Wicked Witch's hat known to exist."



That explains why on Saturday it realized \$2,930,000 after yet another lengthy bidding war.

It's also the only one to feature inside its brim, "M. Hamilton 4461-164" — referring to, of course, Margaret Hamilton, the former kindergarten teacher who loved children yet became the source of so many nightmares. Like the slippers, the legendary Adrian designed this iconic piece of Hollywood history during his historic tenure at MGM; the hat is also featured in the book *The Wizardry*

of Oz. Before Saturday, the Wicked Witch's hat had changed hands only once in more than half a century.

The slippers and hat were joined by numerous other treasures from Oz, including [producer Mervyn LeRoy's copy of the script from the MGM art department](#), which sold for \$50,000; [the screen door from Dorothy's Kansas home](#), which sold for \$37,500; [Judy Garland's "Dorothy Gale" wig from the first week of shooting, which realized \\$30,000](#); and [the MGM contract signed by "Over the Rainbow" songwriters Harold Arlen and E.Y. Harburg](#), which dared to dream a final price of \$23,125.

The Wizard of Oz Museum in Cape Canaveral, Florida, announced over the weekend that it won two items from this historic event: LeRoy's script and [the original gloves worn by actor Burt Lahr as the Cowardly Lion](#), which realized \$20,625.

In this auction, collectors and cinephiles rolled the dice over [the screen-matched primary hero Jumanji game board](#) — the very game "for those who seek to find a way to leave their world behind," complete with four tokens and a pair of dice. The catalog hailed this mahogany-wood wonder as a "supreme example of studio craftsmanship [that] is arguably the most beautifully made film prop we've ever encountered."

And collectors responded appropriately: It opened live bidding Saturday afternoon at \$100,000. But after several minutes, it finally sold for \$275,000.

The auction covered Hollywood history and sparked numerous bidding wars, including a lengthy tussle over [the screen-matched "Concentration No. 3 Gas Bombs" container from 1933's King Kong](#), complete with one prop gas bomb. The wooden container is the only prop from Merian C. Cooper and Ernest B. Schoedsack's masterpiece that Heritage has been able to screen-match — and the first to appear at auction, having been consigned by the family of Desilu Productions Inc. executive Nino Di Gregorio. Live bidding opened at \$15,000. A few minutes later, it exploded to its final price of \$187,500.

A number of bidders got into the Christmas spirit as they tussled over [the knit cap, scarf, coat and mittens Macaulay Culkin wore as Kevin McCallister in 1990's *Home Alone*](#). Live bidding on the iconic ensemble opened at \$32,000. But in the end, one determined collector made sure that while you can mess with a lot of things, you can't mess with kids on Christmas, as the costume sold for \$162,500.

Tom Hanks' iconic "co-star" from Robert Zemeckis' 2000 film *Cast Away* – [a screen-matched "Wilson"](#) — found its way to a new home for \$162,500. And several bidders driven by pure imagination fought over [one of the rare surviving golden tickets from 1971's *Willy Wonka & the Chocolate Factory*](#). A gold-foil, screen-used ticket gaining its lucky recipient admittance to Wonka's candy factory realized \$118,750.

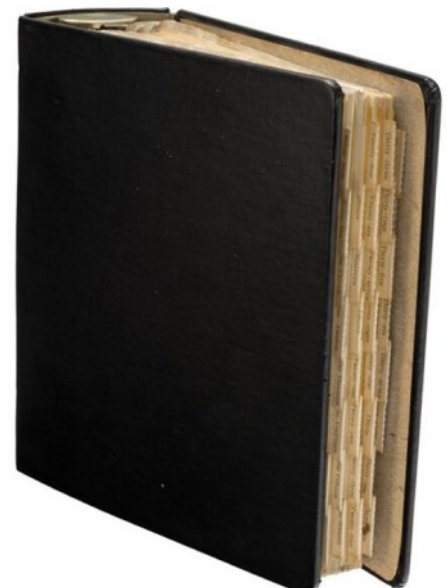

So many items offered in this event were matchless and mythical, among them [author Mario Puzo's copy of Francis Ford Coppola's *The Godfather Notebook*](#), which realized \$100,000. This three-ring binder overflows with character studies and scene synopses and Coppola's page-by-page, line-by-line breakdown of the best-seller, and is such an essential piece of film history it was finally published to great acclaim in 2016. The copy in this auction hailed from the collection of Puzo's assistant, Janet Snow, through whom the author would relay his changes to Coppola.

Last month we presented Part 2 of our National Screen Service article which covered from 1940-1957.

To set the stage, the 1950s brought chaos and diversity to the film industry. To fight the television craze, studios experimented with a wide variety of ideas such as 3D, wide screen films, the oddities of William Castle and much more. Drive-ins were on the rise, so the film industry turned to a younger audience with rock and roll and beach movies.

We pick up at this point...

Part 3

NSS Takes Control 1957-1980

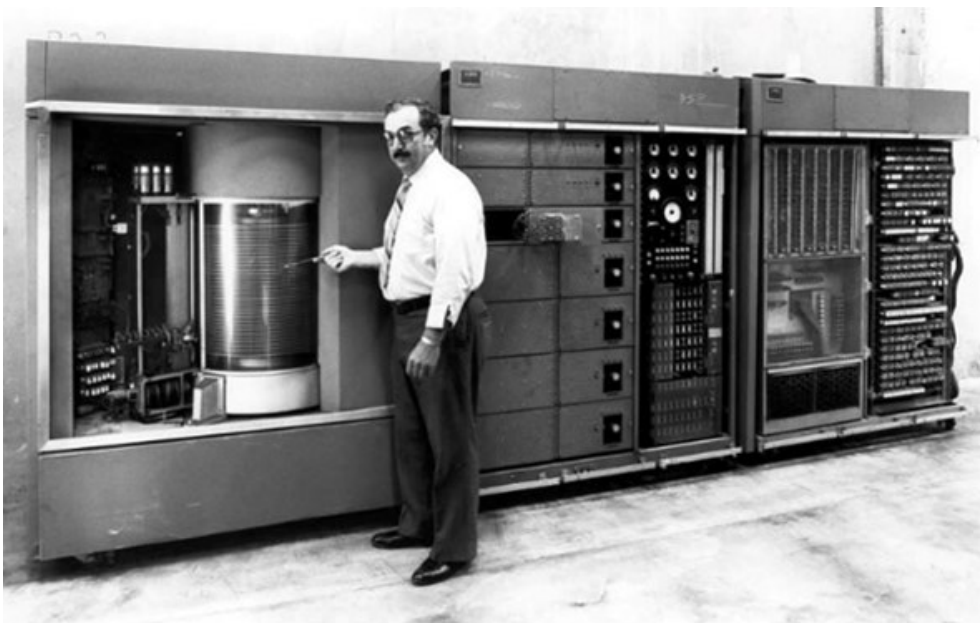
With all the chaos going on in the movie industry, NSS business was booming. But, with all the oddities and variations, they needed more control of the operational process.

The slow-down was waiting for the printing process. Artwork had to be sent out to lithographers to do the physical layout and printing. The dominant in the industry at that time was Morgan Litho. Morgan had won the Litho wars of the past few decades and gobbled up most of the smaller litho shops that handled movie paper.

In 1957, NSS made another brilliant move by purchasing a smaller litho company, Continental Litho, and adapting it to their process. Over the next 3 years, Continental Litho took over and Morgan Litho had to close their doors in 1960 for lack of business.

With success also came the unbelievable burden of controlling all the inventory, orders, and paperwork. Here again, timing was everything.

In 1956, International Business Machines (IBM) created the first hard drive. This isn't like the hard drive of today – notice the man pointing to their new “hard drive.”



In 1960, two major milestones occurred. First, the last of the barrage of lawsuits that had persisted since 1940 over the independent poster exchanges went in favor of NSS, giving NSS dominance in the industry.

And second, IBM announced their new line of computers for large businesses and NSS jumped on it.

In 1962, NSS produced their first 'computerized' inventory list. (We have the 1962 list on file).

This changed how everything was handled and in 1964 all the changes were presented at a national convention unveiling "the New N.S.S."

With printing under control and a new computerized inventory system, NSS mushroomed into a giant.

But, while NSS looked unstoppable, and until the late 1970s they were. But, little did they know that a 'demon-seed' to the company had just been planted in Kansas City, Missouri in 1963 that would cause the fall of the giant.



Stanley Durwood, who had returned from WWII as a navigator, came home to help his ailing father who had purchased the Loew's Midland theater in downtown Kansas City in 1920 (shown in postcard below) and had built it to a 40 theater chain.

In 1960, Stanley's father died and Stanley took over the business. He noticed the large downtown theaters had trouble filling the theater and the balconies were always closed. This made then too costly to operate so he tried to figure a way to do something different with the balconies.

While worrying with this he was presented with a different problem. They had a new theater being built in the suburbs that the dimensions wouldn't allow a full size screen. So, Stanley divided the building and on July 12, 1963, the first designed twin multi-plex theater was born.

In 1966, he built a 4-plex and in 1969, a 6-plex. During this time, Stanley changed the name of their company from Durwood Theaters to American Multi-Cinema which later became AMC Entertainment.

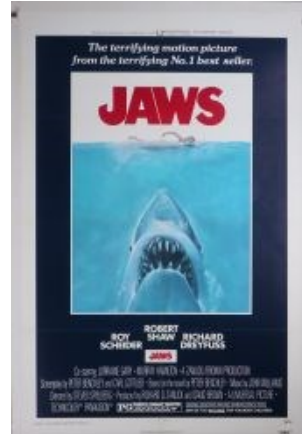

EXPERIENCE

I have been linen backing for over two years, after I retired. I have completed over 100 poster restorations for Morris Everett. I started this business with the help of Morris. He gave me posters to learn the process; and once perfected, I gained his confidence to back his poster collection. I was an executive manager because of my constant process improvement skills and transferred those skills in my linen backing business.

PROCESS

With regards to linen backing. I linen back using conservation techniques. What does that mean? It means I wash EVERY poster, first step is to deacidfy, this opens up the paper fibers to allow the paper bleach to remove stains, toning, water damage, etc. The poster is then mounted on acid free Japanese paper, and 12oz. Canvas. Once dry the poster is then touched up with water color pencils. The process is fully reversible.

I am very happy with this restoration. This was originally poorly paper backed and we were able to fix it and bring it back to its glory.

Dear Posterophiles,

The BLOG is back!

Its delay is due to a long trip in Japan early November where I unearthed hundreds of VERY rare posters and programs - most of which have never been offered by the main auction houses - and which will be revealed by the third week of January along with other similar rare posters from around the world.

As we enter the heart of the Holiday season (Xmas, Hanukkah...), I felt it would be appropriate to share joy and colors that we all can marvel at, regardless of our ages, chromosomes, locations, languages. Few oeuvres can be seen as universal but the Walt Disney canon (past and present) is definitely one of the few that is loved all around the globe

While the Gallery offers hundreds of Disney related posters ([all available here](#)) I particular love the ones designed by one of my favorite Modern artist, i.e. [Tom Whalen](#).

Tom is an American Artist who - after having been influenced by the comic books he read and their vivid colors - started a career as an illustrator after getting a degree at Kutztown University in 1992 and quickly invented his own style which is used in ALL his Art since. The Whalen style can be described as a face split with shadows and light and heavy use of rich colors (particularly orange). Here is Whalen's self portrait to understand it better.

It is in 2011 that Whalen will have a breakthrough thanks to a series of prints commissioned by Mondo and riveting several Walt Disney early shorts. Hundreds of prints will follow with many re-imagining the Disney movies but also marvel movies as well as other well-known universes: Star Trek, Star Wars, The Beatles and Universal Monsters...peaking in 2017 with an exhibition organized by Mondo in Austin.



THIS WEEK'S BLOG ([click here](#)) focuses exclusively on some of the ones he designed for Disney movies, Classics and Pixar era which I have selected in 10 entries.

Here's just one of them i.e. the very rich colored print for [The Jungle Book](#). The character of the 'villain' is - as often in Whalen's oeuvre - bigger than the heroes, giving a welcome twist to the visual.

Tom Whalen is not the only great Artist who has tackled the Disney canon. [Ben Harman](#) is another one who should be applauded for his mix of creativity and ultra rich colors. See the new [Dumbo](#) variant limited edition print paying homage to the Salvador Dali created pink elephants scene (we also offer the regular version).

Aside from limited edition prints, my favorite Disney posters originate from Japan due to their creativity and colors. This very rare style B (B2 sized) poster for the original release of [Robin Hood](#) is one of the harder to find with its die cut printed design. A Gallery exclusive.

Split faces are a staple of great illustration. [Milton Glaser](#) did that way before as you can appreciate on the original poster for the 1969 New York concert given by Jazz piano titans, [Dave Brubeck](#) and [Count Basie](#).

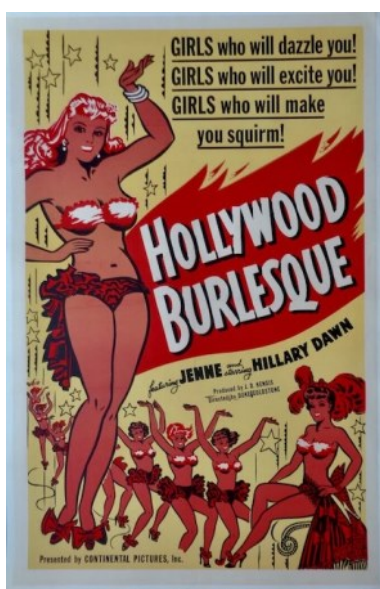
We hope the Russian-Ukraine war will soon end and who better than [Brigitte Bardot](#) to replace bombs with sexy bombshells. Very rare original Russian poster for [Babette s'en va t'en guerre](#). The poster is already linen backed. Another gallery exclusive.



Other pin-ups yet lesser known are the ones adorning the ultra rare one sheet poster for [Hollywood Burlesque](#), the 1949 strip club documentary. The poster is already linen backed.

We remain in Los Angeles with an equally ultra rare original poster printed in very limited numbers (less than 50 according to some sources) for the Nicaragua Benefit concert [The Rolling Stones](#) played at the Los Angeles Forum on January 18, 1973. I wish all the best of luck finding another one!

Can't mention the Stones without also featuring [The Beatles](#). Original set of 4 now iconic posters with psychedelic portraits by Richard Avedon printed in 1967 by NEMS (The Beatles publishing company) and sold in the UK, Germany and the Netherlands. This is the German Stern Magazine set and all posters are perfectly linen backed.



As famous as the Beatles in the mid 60's was [Batman](#), thanks to the ultra campy and goofy TV series. Its success prompted the release of the [Batman movie](#) in 1966 which has become one of the 'cultest' ever. Here's the very rare original Japanese movie Program with colorful photos.

Equally as cult is the [Star Trek](#) series from the 1960's which spawned many movies since including probably its best spoof being [Galaxy Quest](#) in 1999. Rare Japanese poster with unique design.

Another image - as Psychedelic as it is iconic - is the one designed by [Lee Conklin](#) for [The Grateful Dead](#), Steppenwolf and Santana shows at San Francisco's Fillmore West in 1968. The image was so well received that Santana used it for their album cover. This is the original BG 134 second print poster printed post-concert.

Hear me out here!!! While truly shocking and revolting, Italy, France, Germany, Canada and the US ALL produced, filmed and released several movies between 1969 and 1976 that are now called [Nazisploitation movies](#). Most of the scenarii featured interned women in Nazi camps being subjugated to depravity, terror and torture. Hollywood and other major international studios and theaters ALL released them without complaints at the time (it was legal as Nazism and its emblems were not yet banned in most of these countries - still not in the US!!!) which speaks volumes of the lack of morals and and culture of greed in the Entertainment industry!!! Here is one of the rarest of those posters: the Italian poster for [Love Camp 7](#) with its painting by [Rino Ferrari](#).

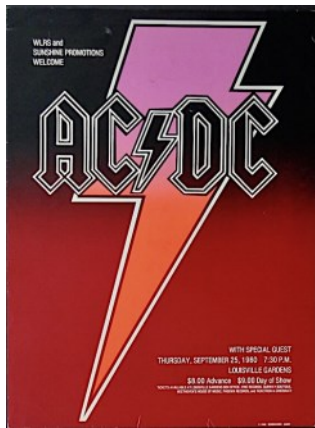


So yes the beast is not gone and it constantly rears its ugly head thru dark, red or green fascism with Jews / antisemitism being its first prey. This commercial poster designed by David Reisinger in 1993 and titled [Again?](#) has sadly never been more potent.

Great minimalistic design again but for a louder and more joyful theme...Music, with this rare original concert poster printed for [AC DC](#)'s 1980 show in Lexington, Kentucky.

Back in the late 70's, some pious souls said that AC DC's Music was the sound of Hell and would encourage murder!!! While it certainly had a massive effect on neck ache, it didn't come close to the gruesomeness of such movies as [Red Rings Of Fear](#), the 1978 Italian Giallo. British Quad poster Art by [Tom William Chantrell](#).

Horror up a notch with an eerie image of a used for the German release of [Burial Ground](#), the 1981 Italian zombie movie.



We much prefer to look at the soulful face of Blues legend [John Lee Hooker](#) used to promote his 1972 Canadian Tour.

With over 300 posters offered, [Renato Casaro](#) is the Gallery's favorite Artist and it's easy to understand why when looking at its vivid painting for the 1970 Italian S/M erotic movie, [Forbidden Photos Of A Lady Above Suspicion](#).

Romance can be murderous too as we learned in [True Romance](#), Tony Scott's violent movie revisited by [Paul Mann](#) with an incredible brand new limited edition print (we also offer the Variant print).

Thankfully, the French have a less violent concept of romance as portrayed in [La nuit americaine](#), the love letter to moviemaking directed by [Francois Truffaut](#) and starring [Jacqueline Bisset](#) at the peak of her beauty. Very rare large 2 panel Italian poster.

Love. The most incredible feeling present in all creatures. Love for another being...or for our country. Very rare original head shop print titled [I Want To Love It More](#) with black light inks and flocking. A perfect condition original poster from 1971 which also happens to be in the collection of the Whitney Museum as an essential part of the counterculture era.
